Records in Junior Division

Amherst-Williamsville won the team championship with 107 1/2 points, followed by Alden, with 58, Lancaster-Depew, with 48 1/2, Lackawanna, with 43 and Orchard Park, with 35.

Of 16 records broken, 6 were in the Junior Boys and Girls Divisions, 5 in the Midget, 3 in the Senior and 2 in the Junior Sections.

Joining Jaworski and Seidl as record-breakers were: Midgets: James Goss of Evans-Angola, who ran 50 yards in 7.2 seconds; Lackawanna's Dave Purnell, who won the standing broad-jump with a jump of 7 feet, 9 inches; Victoria Strycharz of Lackawanna, who ran 50 yards in :07.5 and two 12-inch softball throwers Joanne Holl of Evans-Angola, with a toss of 111 feet, 6 inches, and Dan Copeland of Holland, with 162-11.

The only Junior-Division record-breakers also were softball throwers: Tom Cowan of Newstead-Akron, with 216 feet, 10 inches, and Amherst-Williamsville's Jolene Ehret, with 161-11.

Orchard Park's Barbara Downey, a second-baseman-pitcher for Our Lady of Sacred Heart's Catholic Youth Council's softball team, won the softball-throw in the Intermediate Division in 161 feet, 8 inches.

Six Brothers Play Ball

Asked how she became such a strong-armed thrower, she smiled: "Why-y, I have six brothers who are ball-players."

Carolyn Lehr of Amherst-Williamsville lowered her own Intermediate 50-yard mark of :07.3 to :06.9 and later helped her 220-yard relay team clip two seconds off Alden's old record in :30.4.

Jim Finnell of Amherst-Williamsville raced the 890-yards in :2:07.4 and the Amherst-Williamsville Intermediate 440-yard relay team did their specialty in :48 for another record.

Bolton Wins 'Triple' In AAU Track Meet; Narrowly Misses 4th

By the margin of 2 1/2 inches! That's how close Isaac (Ike) Bolden of the Bennett Athletic Club came Saturday to winning four titles in the Niagara District Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) track-and-field championships in All-High Stadium.

Ike soared 20 feet 4 1/2 inches in the running broad-jump. This put him second to teammate Israel Washington, who won with 20-6 1/2.

At it was, the 18-year-old East High School hurdles champion scored one of the few triple-wins in history by taking the 100-yard crown in 9.9 seconds; the 20-hurdles in :26.2—after Lewiston's Lt. Jim Smith fell while leading—and the 220-sprint in :22.2.

The double champions crowned in this meet, co-sponsored by The Buffalo Evening News and the Niagara District AAU, were Park School's Barry Cave and Ed Moran of Kanc, Pa.

Cave, competing only because Herb Mols, Park's athletic director, paid his \$1 entry fee in the "11th hour," won the 16-pound shot-put at 44 feet 9 3/4 inches and the discus at 113 feet 4 3/4 inches.

Moran's half-mile and mile run victories were notable because he had worked until 7 AM Saturday loading steel blocks in a steel mill. Then, after 4 1/2 hours' sleep, he won the half-mile in 1:59.5 and the mile in 4:33.9. The summaries follow:

30 SWIM EVENTS CARDED MONDAY IN JUNIOR OLYMPICS

A total of 30 events will be swum Monday when the Town of Amherst Junior Olympic swim trials are held in the new Amherst Junior High School.

Sixteen boys events and 14 for girls will be held in four age groups: Ten and under, 11-12, 13-14 and 15-16. Competition will include freestyle, breaststroke and relay events. First event will be run off at 2:30 PM.

The winners of this competition will swim Aug. 4 in the county championships in Orchard Park and the winners there will swim against Buffalo champions Aug. 11 in the Kensington outdoor pool.

Robert Bedell, Village of Williamsville recreation director, is in charge of the Amherst event. Contestants do not have to file entries for the meet. Their entries will be officially recorded following the meet.
