No Lake Ambitions

After her record-shattering performances, Miss Barber qualified for the headlines again when she said she doesn't harbor any plans to swim Lake Ontario or any other lake or channel.

"I like swimming in races up to 200 yards, but not further," she said. "That's fun. Those distance swims don't appeal to me."

Sarah hasn't quite made up her mind whether she'll teach physical education or become a missionary, and says she won't decide until it's time for her to go to college three years from now.

Portia Hancock, 15-year-old member of the Indianapolis Athletic Club, was the meet's only triple winner. The Indiana lass won three events in the 15 and 16 class, taking the 100-yard backstroke, 100-yard freestyle and 100-yard breaststroke. Her 1:26.8 in the breaststroke is a Niagara District record.

Mary Ann Marchino, also representing the Indianapolis AC, and Donna Newcombe, Hamilton, Ont., each won two events.

Competing in the over-16 bracket, 17-year-old Mary Ann took the 100-yard freestyle and 100-yard breaststroke. Donna, 12, swimming in the 11 and 12-year-old class, won the 50-yard freestyle and 50-yard backstroke.

Another Indianapolis swimmer, Lynn Blackburn, posted a Niagara District record by winning the 50-yard breaststroke for 13 and 14-year-olds in :36.8 as the event was swum here for the first time.

Many Times Runner-up, Barrett Wins Its First Junior Olympic Crown

Records were as scarce as sunshine Tuesday as the athletes of Barrett Playground, coached by Mrs. Daniel J. Mahaney, compiled 77 points in the rain to win their first City Junior Olympic track championship in All-High Stadium.

"My teams have had many seconds," Mrs. Mahaney said after the meet, "but this is my first winner. And I'm really delighted."

By noon, Barrett's athletes in the Midget (11 years), Junior (12-13) and Intermediate (14-15) had compiled all their 77 points. Those figures held up as the Senior (16-17) division youngsters from Roosevelt tried vainly to overtake the pace-setters. Roosevelt fell short, scoring 50 points for second place.

Kathleen Ties Record

Getting back to records, one was broken and one was tied twice by the girl who established it a year ago.

That girl was Kathleen Krajewski, a Holy Spirit School sprinter running for Barrett. She raced 75 yards twice in 9.4 seconds to equal her Junior Division mark.

Mention of Miss Krajewski brings up an oddity too. Two heats for the 75-yard dash were run twice. The first time officials picked the wrong finish line and the distance was only 50 yards. Then they re-ran the heats at 75 yards. The first three finishers in the 50-yard events also finished in that order at the longer distance. Miss Krajewski won her heat at both distances. So did Carol Gerlach of Dewey Playground.

Shoshone's Barry Cave, whose name wasn't even in the program, was the day's only record breaker.

Qualifiers Gain County Finals

Competing in the senior boys' 12-pound shot-put, he topped the old mark of 47 feet 6 inches with all three of his efforts. The Park School youngster's first toss went 49 feet 3 inches, the second 51 1/2 and the last 50-8.

Karen Becker of High playground won the 12-inch softball throw and the 75-yard dash final in the senior girls' division, while Grace Bauer of Schiller was second in both events. Miss Bauer took first in the standing broad jump final with Miss Becker second.

The afternoon program opened with a brief prayer in memory of the late Robert C. Stedler, sports editor emeritus of The Buffalo Evening News, who started Junior Olympic track competition here six years ago. Mr. Stedler died June 4.

The city championships were co-sponsored by the Recreation Department and The News. Qualifiers in Tuesday's city championships will represent Buffalo against the suburban champions July 21 in the Erie County Junior
