

# 1 National Record Bettered In Suburban Junior Olympics

"I will honestly and purposely keep my mind and body clean. I will compete as a good sportsman; competes, be generous in victory, gracious in defeat."

THAT'S the Junior Olympic code.

Every one of the 1000 athletes who competed in Monday's opening track events of Junior Olympic Week solemnly repeated it before they went on the field and gave their best to win.

Western New York's biggest track carnival got off to a record start in the Suburban Championship meet on Howe Field in Hamburg, and in the City Championship in All-High Stadium.

In fact, it opened in almost national-record fashion, except such marks are recognized in the Erie County championship finals. They are scheduled at 5 PM Friday on the same field.

About those would-be national marks: One was bettered by suburban athletes.

Senior girls Carolyn Lehr of Amherst-Williamsville and Susan Krehbiel of Clarence each leaped six inches farther than the national record of 3 feet 6 inches in the standing broad-jump. They tied for first.

Last Record Tumbles

Dick Snow of Amherst-Williamsville clipped a full tenth of a second off the county mark of 24.3 in the intermediate boys 220-yard dash. And Tim Burns of Tonawanda-Kenmore ran the senior boys mile in 4 minutes 45.7 seconds. The county mark is 5:31.6.

All the above marks are new county records. So was the 8-foot 4-inch leap which Anne Wallace of Grand Island made in the junior girls standing broad-jump. It topped the three-year-old mark of 8-2 1/4.

Team honors Monday went to Tonawanda-Kenmore with 81 points. Defending champion Amherst-Williamsville was second with 63 1/2. Lackawanna third with 53, Alden fourth with 48 and West Seneca fifth with 28 1/2.

The Swimmers Take Over

The leader of the City qualifier

Monday in Buffalo's All-High Stadium was a newcomer, Mineral Spring Playground, with 69 points. Barrett Playground, the perennial champion, was second with 58 and Sycamore third with 50.

The Junior Olympic spotlight today turned to the swimmers. The City qualifier started at 5:30 PM today in Kensington Pool.

The Suburban natators test their skill at 1 PM tomorrow in the Lancaster outdoor pool. The qualifiers in each meet will match strokes for the County championships at 2 PM Saturday in Kensington Pool.

Brief ceremonies preceded Monday's Suburban Track qualifiers on Howe Field. The Olympic Pledge was read and a recording of the National Anthem followed.
