

Jamestown Girl Breaks National AAU Record

In another special team contest, the Jamestown city champions visited the Park School pool last Saturday to defeat the Town of Amherst champions in a special meet arranged by Meet Director Herb Mols with the Jamestown coach Dick Bowers. Linda Brown, 12 year-old breast-stroker broke the 40 yds. record for 12 and under girls as she sped the distance in :29.7 to break the old standard by 1.3 seconds. Glenn Fisk of Jamestown was thwarted in his try for the 40 yard free-style record by only .2 seconds.

This was the second and final meet especially arranged for the Town champions in the hope that such meets would meet with sufficient favor so that they could be planned for in the regular summer season. The enthusiasm of the Jamestown group, escorted by cars driven by parents leads to the hope that similar arrangements could be made with local parents so that regular meets could be held with neighboring towns throughout the summer.

Erie Youth Sets New 'Conquer Lake' Record

Dave Schabaker, 14-year-old Erie, Pa. schoolboy, established a record time as 34 swimmers took part in the Third Annual "Con-

quer Chautauqua Lake Swim" Saturday.

Young Schabaker, starting from Prendergast Point, swam the 1 1/4 mile distance to Midway Park in 27:03, besting by 10 minutes and seven seconds the previous low standard set by Jamestown's Don Zeolle.

In fact, the first 18 finishers better the old record.

Carol Fetzer of the Jamestown "Y" repeated as winner in the Women's Division but Bill Radack missed out in his bid to become a three-time winner when Ted Parker of Erie beat by 22 seconds in Men's competition.

Of the eight divisions, Jamestown YMCA took four firsts; Erie YMCA three and Erie YWCA, one.

All contestants were awarded certificates and the division winners were presented trophies. The youngest swimmer was nine-year-old Diana Brown.

Two-time winners, Bill Radack and Carol Fetzer look like the best bets among 23 entries already received for Saturday's "Conquer Lake Chautauqua" swim, YMCA Physical Director Dick Bower said last night.

Radack and Fetzer have won each time since the 'Y'-sponsored event was begun.

Jamestown and Erie splashes headline five of the other six age divisions. Erie's Frank Pettinato and David Schabaker are top-rated in the boys' 13-14 and 15-16 groups.

'Y' entries Linda Brown, who last Saturday set a national AAU record for the 40-yard breaststroke, Glen Fisk and Louise Culbertson of Warren top the girls' and boys' under 12 and the girls' 15-16 classification. Nancy Lombard of Erie is top-seeded among 13-14 girls.

The 1 1/4-mile swim from Prendergast Point to Midway Park beach will begin at 2 P.M. Anyone who succeeds in crossing will receive a certificate and gold Oscars will be awarded to all division winners.
