STARTER Bill Sanford of the University of Buffalo had a red face Saturday at the Erie County Junior Olympic Swimming Meet in the Kensington Pool. And he couldn't blame it on the near 90-degree temperature.

Three times nine anxious youngsters lined up to start the opening race, a 25-yard freestyle event for boys 10 years and under. And three times they were off to a false start because Sanford's gun failed to go off.

That called for a gun inspection. And guess what the officials discovered? Somebody had put the blank cartridges in backwards.

Scorer Walter Scott, an official at swimming and track meets for 30 years, couldn't believe it.

75 Points for Kensington

"It just shows that something new and different usually happens at these meets," commented Scott.

Once the gun started shooting, Kensington Pool swimmers started accumulating their winning total of 75 points, returning the county championship to the City Division. Kensington's boys scored 45 points and the girls 30. Both totals won division championships.

Rees finished second in overall competition with 43 points, followed by Amherst-Williamsville, the defending champion, with 36 and Riverside with 31.

Twelve records were set, six in individual events and six in the relays. Seven of the marks were made by Kensington swimmers, five individual and two relay.



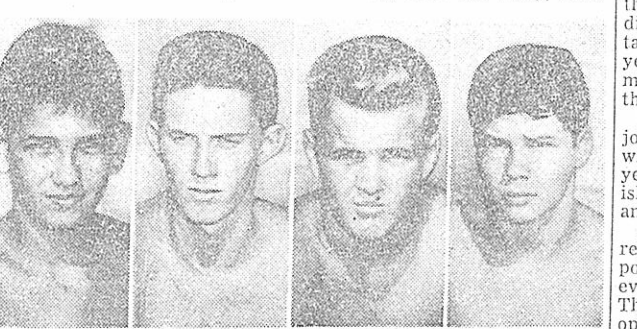

in the girls' 15-16-year-old bracket, she swam 50 yards in 33.8 seconds and 100 yards in 1 minute 19 seconds.

Other Kensington record breakers were Nick Ferreri in the 50-yard breaststroke for 11-12-year-olds, :41; Pete Bergstrom in the 13-14-year division, 100-yard freestyle in 1:03.9, and Jack Boehm in the 100-yard freestyle for 15-16-year-olds, 1:02.9.

The other individual mark was set in the girls' 11-12-year-old bracket when Cindy Engler of West Seneca won the 50-yard freestyle in :36.5.

Kensington's two relay records were set in the 13-14-year-old division. Each occurred in the 200-yard freestyle, one for boys and the other for girls.

400 Youngsters Compete

Amherst-Williamsville had two record-breaking relay teams in the 11-12-year and 15-16-year girls' divisions. Tonawanda's quartet established a boys' mark in the 15-year-old boys' team posted a mark. All these records were in the 200-yard freestyle.

Nick Greco of Centennial Pool joined Miss Balasky as a double winner. Competing in the 10-years-and-under bracket, he finished first in the 25-yard freestyle and 25-yard breaststroke.

Approximately 400 youngsters, representing 13 city and county pools, competed. The annual 28-event program was sponsored by The Buffalo Evening News in cooperation with the Parks Department, Recreation Division, the Erie County Youth P...
