12 Junior Are Broken

TWELVE records were shattered in the Erie County Junior Olympic Swimming Championships in Cazenovia Pool.

Approximately 300 youngsters, ranging from 10 to 17 in age, competed Friday on the 38-event program sponsored by The Buffalo Evening News in co-operation with the Erie County and City Recreation Departments.

Bill Bartlett of Houghton Pool broke the Intermediate (13-14 Years) Boys' 50-yard freestyle mark with a 27.1-second effort. That clipped seven-tenths of a second off his performance last year.

3 Events, 3 Records

The individual star of the program was Kerry O'Hara of the Tonawanda Town B team. He broke three intermediate records. He lowered his own 50-yard butterfly by 1.8 seconds with a 28.3 swim, clipped 9.1 seconds off Jeff Wulf's mark with a 1:04.5 effort in the 100-yard backstroke and reduced his own 200-yard freestyle standard by 9.4 seconds with a 2:12.7 performance.

Kerry's brother, Tim, tied Tom Farenholz's year-old senior (15-16) butterfly mark by covering the 50 yards in 28 seconds flat. Tim then reduced his own 200-yard freestyle mark by five-tenths of a second with a 2:11.8 effort.

Relay Record Broken

Dale Newburger of Amherst shaved 1.4 seconds off the 25-yard Midget (10-Years and Under) Boys' backstroke mark with a 17.2 performance.

The Tonawanda City 200-yard freestyle relay team lowered the senior mark of 1:46 held by Tonawanda-Kenmore. The new figure is 2.1 seconds less. Members of the quartet are Bill Fisher, Tim Niland, Jeff Wulf and Lloyd Milliman.

The record-breaking aqua-queen was Angie Jankowski of the Tonawanda Town B team. She broke two records. She clipped 2.4 seconds off the Senior (15-16) Girls' 50-yard backstroke with a 35.5 effort and lessened the 50-butterfly mark by 1.6 seconds with a 35.6 mark.
