Amherst Athletes Take Fourth in Track Meet

Last week Wednesday an under-manned but determined Town of Amherst squad of boys and girls competed at Hamburg in the annual Suburban Eric County Junior Olymplc Track and Field meet. The sen-ior boys (16-17 years) not only led in point scoring but managed to set 3 new records for the meet, and there-by bring Amherst-Williamsville into 4th place behind Lackawanna, Alden and Hamburg in the team standings.

Tom Zierk of Snyder proved one of the outstanding performers of the day as he broke the broad jump record with a leap or 19'--11½" and dashed home first in the 100-yard dash in creditable time of 11:2 on the heavy track. Bill Galvin added anrecord to his list as he put the 43'81/2". Bob Manske made his shot 43'81/6". first crack at the mile run in a winning effort as he broke the tape in 5:09.8, also a new record. Len Johnson finished 2nd in the 220 as he pushed Dick Powers to a new meet record while Bob Wilson gained a 2nd place in the 440.

Earl Campbell contributed two 2nds to the team total as he placed in the Intermediate boys (14-15) 100yard dash and the broad jump, in each case being nosed out by record-

breaking performances.

The only girl entry from Amherst in any class was Carolyn Lehr of Eggertsville who took two 2nds in the Junior (13 and under) division as she placed 2nd in the 75-yard dash and

the standing broad jump.

All of the above point winners thus earned the right to represent the sub-urban Eric County team in its annual run-off with the City of Buffalo champions on Aug. 13 (today) at All-High Stadium in Buffalo.

In addition to the above point scor-ers, Ted Totman tied for 4th in the Intermediate boys high jump while Peter Minich scored the only Junior Boys points when he jumped to a 4th place in the standing broad jump.

Amherst Track Team Ties For Fourth in Junior Olympic Finals

A week ago Amherst-Williamsville emerged from the qualifying suburban track meet with a fourth. Last Thursday, the cream of the county engaged their city cousins in the finals of the Junior Olympic track program for 1953. While the City of Buffalo team managed an overall victory, the Amherst group gained a tie for 4th in competition with all of the playgrounds and towns.

Bill Galvin of Snyder repeated his win of last week by outputting the Buffalo shotputters with a toss of 43 ft. 9 in. Carolyn Lehr, the only Amherst girl competing improved on her performance of last week by winning the standing broad jump with a leap of 7 ft. 9 in to turn the tables on her Alden opponent of last week. Carolyn also added a 4th place in the 75-yd. dash to tie her with Tom Zierk as high point getter for the Town forces.

Tom Zierk was nosed out in both the senior 100 and broadjump, in both cases by a matter of inches, the 100 finish being a photo finish for the judges. Len Johnson came in a close third in the 220, while Bob Wilson and Bob Manske took 4th places in the 440 and mile respectively.

This was the 4th annual year of the Junior Olympic program which is co-sponsored by the Erie County Youth Recreation program and the Buffalo Recreation Dept.
