

One National, Nine County Marks Broken in Junior Olympic Track

ONE national record was broken, nine county marks shattered and another tied.

That's the statistical story of the Erie County Junior Olympic Track & Field Championships Friday night on Howe Field in Hamburg.

The largest crowd in the eight-year history of the event for youngsters was on hand. About 3000. And they weren't disappointed, although the start of the meet was delayed about 40 minutes because of the late arrival of the city athletes by bus.

Fact is, the city group didn't arrive until after the parade of athletes and officials to the flagpole for a reading of the Junior Olympic Code. Speeches of welcome followed. And finally the real action.

County Records Fall

Carolyn Lehr of Amherst-Williamsville is a national record-holder for the second straight year. She won the Senior Girls standing broad-jump with a leap of 8 feet 10 3/4 inches. That was 4 inches farther than the current national mark. Miss Lehr also won the softball throw with a toss of 174 feet 10 inches.

County record-breakers were: Ray Mingle of West Seneca in the Midget Boys 12-inch softball throw; Al Franz of Elma in that division's standing broad-jump; Barbara Jean Buster of Willert Playground in the Midget Girls 12-inch softball throw.

Larry Nehring of Eden in the Intermediate Boys running high-jump; Nick Kiefer of Mineral Spring playground in the 8-pound shot-put; Beverly Mancuso of Massachusetts Playground in the Intermediate Girls 12-inch softball throw.

Four Double Winners
The Dupes of Tonawanda-Kenmore in the Senior Boys mile run, Bill Jefferson of Barrett Playground in the senior running broad-jump.

Marilyn Kobielski of Sycamore tied the 8 feet 2 1/4 inch mark in the Junior Girls standing broad-jump.

Among double winners with

Miss Lehr were Mingle, Jefferson and Warren Hardy of Holland. Hardy finished first in the Intermediate Boys 100-yard dash and running broad-jump.

Highlight of the parade to the flagpole was the marching and playing of the Lake Shore Junior Drum Corps, led by Baton

Major Marilyn P. Danitz of Hamburg.

Meet Well Conducted

Another high point was the presentation of Olympic jackets to last year's national champions. They were Susan Krehbiel of Clarence, Jackie Goss of

Evans-Angola and Carolyn Lehr of Amherst-Williamsville.

Though the meet started late, much lost time was recovered through the efficiency of Referee Roland Murray and Chief Judge John Ambrose and their staff of Niagara District AAU officials.
