

Park Leads DeVeaux In Unfinished Game, To Be Resumed June 3

Park School and DeVeaux Military School started to play a baseball game in Niagara Falls at 5 P. M. Wednesday. But it won't be finished until June 3 at Snyder.

Rules say that a game is official only if the team second at bat (DeVeaux) has scored more runs in 4 innings than the team first at bat (Park) has scored in 5 innings.

Wednesday, the game was delayed an hour by rain. DeVeaux led, 7 to 0, going into the first half of the fifth inning. That was at 5:50 P. M. and the pre-game agreement was that play would cease at 6 P. M.

Then Park scored eight runs. Catcher Jim Hufford began the rally with a grounder to shortstop and was safe when he crashed into and knocked unconscious the DeVeaux first baseman, Bob Jackson, who was in the base path. Jackson was taken out and the game continued. Park's key blow was a three-run double by Jim Carney.

NIAGARA FALLS, May 26.—A baseball game that began April 27 was ended here Wednesday afternoon when DeVeaux Military School of the Falls defeated Park School from Snyder, 13 to 10, in nine innings. Rain stopped play after four innings on the first date with DeVeaux leading, 7 to 0, after Park had rallied for eight runs in the first half of the fifth inning.

Wednesday, DeVeaux actually outscored Park, 6 to 2, in the remainder of the game. Relief pitcher Bob Corlett hitting two doubles and Don Perison a triple. Park's Terry Cheek pitched the remaining innings and finished with ten strikeouts.
