

PARK SCHOOL TEAM RETAINS TRACK TITLE

 ROCHESTER, May 23.—Park School of Buffalo retained its title in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools senior and junior track and field meet at Harley School here Saturday morning but lost a CUPS baseball game to Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 7 to 0.

Pebble Hill's pitcher, Dave Ware, pitched his third no-hit, no-run game against Park but the first in the history of the CUPS. Ware didn't issue a walk and struck out 16 Park batters. Park's Terry Cheek pitched three-hit ball and struck out 14. P. H. now leads the league with a won-3, lost-1 record while Park has a won-3, lost-2 mark.

In the track meet, Park amassed a total of 139 points as five places counted on an 8-5-3-2-1 scoring system. Park used an 18-man team to account for 6 of 12 CUPS records set and win 9 of 19 events. Park's point winners and their finishes follow:

Rochester, May 21—The Park School successfully defended its conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championships today by rolling up 139 points in the annual pentangular meet. Pebble Hill was second with 96 points, Lakemont third with 63, Harley fourth with 27 and Allendale fifth with 26.

In the junior division, Joe Scandurra of Park won the 50-yard dash, was second in the 100, third in the broad jump and ran a leg on his school's victorious relay team. In the senior bracket, Jim Hufford took the high jump with a 5-9 effort and Franz Allina the mile in 5.26.

The Park baseball team, however, suffered its second loss in five CUPS stars, bowing to Pebble Hill, 7-0. Dave Ware, a righthander, tossed a no-hitter against Park.

Orchard Park amassed 64 1/2 points to outscore Depew with 27 1/2 and Park School from Snyder with 26 in a triangular track and field meet at Orchard Park Thursday afternoon. The most creditable performance was a 20-foot 4-inch jump by Johnny Zier, unsational Orchard Park sophomore.

Martin (Whitey) Bedford, a sophomore, scored 8 points and Bill Lewis 6 1/2 as Coach Dwight Monnier's Parkmen won eight of 11 events. Park won only the 600-yard relay as Bill Bridge and Bill Lewis accounted for 15 1/2 points between them. WILSON DEFEATS PARK TRACK TEAM

Wilson High School's track-and-field team scored a 58-to-37 victory over Park School of Buffalo in Snyder Friday afternoon. It won seven of 11 events, including a sweep in the broad jump. It was to have been a triangular meet, but Elba failed to appear.

Feature of Wilson's triumph was that of a 15-year-old, 6-foot 2-inch, 135-pound freshman, Bob Neuman, winning the discus with a toss of 113 feet 4 inches. Only double victor was Park's Bill Bridge. He won the 100-yard low hurdles in :11.4 and the 100 dash in :10.8. Summaries follow:
