Park School Opens 6-Man Grid Series At Snyder Tomorrow

Park School of Buffalo will open its six-man football season against Our Lady of Victory of Lackawanna at Snyder tomorrow morning at 11 o'clock. And Coach Herb Mols' speedsters will be seeking to preserve their string of ten games without a defeat.

Park's first team will include: Ends Dick Carl and Pete Dow, Center Set. Bridge, Quarterback Jim Hufford, Halfback Bill Bridge and Terry Check, 185-pound fullback who has added 25 pounds since last season. The defending champion in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools Park will play six league games with Oct. 15 as an open date.

Park School Wins Opener 45-6, in Title Defense.

SYRACUSE, Oct. 10. — Park School of Buffalo defeated Pebble Hill, 45 to 6, here Saturday afternoon to successfully open defense of its Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) Six-Man Football title. It was Park's 12th consecutive win in three years, second this season.

Bill Bridge scored three touchdowns on runs of 39, 49 and 77 yards; Dick Carl tallied two on dashes of 45 and 59 while Ray Cicezer was over on a pass from Dave Ware followed by Terry Check's 51-yard touchdown pass to Pete Dow.

Park School Gridders Trim Pebble Hill

Syracuse, Oct. 9.—The Park School grid team tallied at least one touchdown in each period today to defeat Pebble Hill, 45-6, in a CUPS game. Nearly all the Park TDs were racked up on long runs. It was the 12th straight victory for Park over a three-year span.

Dick Carl scampered 45 yards for the first Park TD. Dave Ware flipped a long pass to Ray Cicezer for the second score. In the second period, Bill Bridge hit paydirt after a 49-yard run and Terry Check rifled a 51-yard TD pass to Pete Dow. Bridge tallied in the third period, going 39 yards off tackle. Carl registered this second TD in the last stanza, a 59-yard dash and Bridge capped the onslaught with his third TD, a 77-yard jaunt.
