Harley Topples Park School Five

Rochester, Jan. 20.—Harley School today took over first place in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools basketball race by handing Park School of Snyder its first setback, 28-24. Substitute center, Paul Kober took personal charge in the last period to give Harley its second straight CUPS victory. The setback was Park's first in four starts.

Kober gave Harley the lead for the first time at 25-24 with only two minutes left in the game. He meshed all three of Harley's last period field goals. Terry Cheek collected 11 points for Park. Teammate Ted Okie, who fouled out with two minutes remaining, added seven. Kober's 13-point production paced Harley.

Park Basketeers Split in Rochester

The Park School basketball team invaded Rochester last week end and returned home after splitting in both junior varsity and varsity competition. On Friday night, Allendale School won the JV contest by a score of 40-13 after being behind 6-4 in the first quarter. The Park varsity squared matters by winning 58-45, leading throughout the contest. Ted Okie established a new CUPS league record by scoring 27 points to lead Park to its 2nd straight league victory. Terry Cheek added 13 points, while Chuck Lewis was high for Allendale with 16.

On Saturday afternoon, Park concluded CUPS league action for the week end by meeting Harley School, a game featuring undefeated varsity squads. Vince Cuvillo led the Junior Varsity team to a 29-25 win, although Vince Zimmerman of Harley was high for the game with 17 points. In the varsity contest, Park went down to its first defeat of the year, when a last period rally by Harley finally caught up to and passed the visitors. Park led throughout the contest, until with three minutes remaining, a sub-

stitute center, Paul Kober, threw in a basket to give Harley the lead, and then added two more to clinch the win. Terry Cheek with 11 points led Park scorers, while Ted Okie was held to 7 points, having labored under a 4-foul handicap during the second half and finally leaving the game with two minutes remaining.

Park resumes competition on Friday, Feb. 2, when it entertains Pebble Hill School of Syracuse, defending champions of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools.

Park School Cagers Active

Pioneers Win One, Lose Two—Sets Gym Scoring Record.

The Park School basketball team returned to the courts after a two-week layoff to set a new school scoring record in defeating Pebble Hill School of Syracuse 84-30. This was Park's first win over Pebble Hill, defending CUPS champions, in 2 years. Terry Cheek and Ted Okie again led Park's scoring with 22 and 16 points respectively.

In the annual game at Nichols, Park ran out of steam in the second half and Nichols romped to a 63-33 win. Pete Hochreiter, with a 20-point second half and a total of 26 points, led Nichols, while Terry Cheek and Frank Soldwedel kept the Pioneers in the game up through the first half as Park left the floor on the short end of a 21-17 score.

Lakemont Academy visited Park last Saturday and walked off with a 71-42 victory to keep their chances of a Cornell Cup championship alive. With the start of the second round next week, Harley School of Rochester has had no defeats, Lakemont one, and Park two defeats, with any one of the three still very much in contention. Alan Kiser, 6-7 center, broke the Park individual scoring record for the gym by dropping in 28 points. He received much support from 6-4 John Casey and 6-2 Cam Hitchcock. Ted Okie and Terry Cheek kept the Pioneers in the running by scoring 16 and 13 points respectively. The mumps, which removed Park's coach, Herb Mols, from the scene last week, and the flu bug, which had several boys down as well as two regulars out, didn't help Park's drive for their last 2 games.
