

Park Cagers Trip Harley in Finale

Park School's basketball team defeated Harley School of Rochester, 58-48, yesterday at Park. It was the final game of the season for Park, which tied for second place in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools with a 5-3 slate.

Ted Okie and Terry Cheek tallied 22 and 15 points, respectively, to pace the winners. The game marked the end of the scholastic basketball career of both lads. Okie racked up 440 points at the Park School, while Cheek made 332. Paul Kober was high for Harley with 19.
