PARK SCHOOL AGAIN WINS CUPS TITLES IN FOOTBALL, TRACK

Park retained its six-man football crown, extending its undefeated streak to 24 games, and also retained its Syracuse Cup track title. In basketball and soccer, Park was runner-up.

In track, Cheek was shot-put and discus king. Pete Dow won the 100 and 220, Gay the 880, Seth Bridge the mile, Bill Bridge the high and broad jump.
