

### Park Gridders Defeat Pebble Hill, 26 to 6

Frank Soldwedel racked up two touchdowns and scored a pair of extra points to pace the Park School of Snyder to a 26-6 victory over Pebble Hill of Syracuse in a CUPS game yesterday at Park. The win was Park's fifth straight of the season and 22d over a three-year span.

Soldwedel scored on dashes of seven and six yards. He also caught a pair of PAT passes from Terry Cheek. Dan Pantera tallied another TD on a 36-yard sprint. The fourth Park six-pointer was recorded on a pass-lateral play from Joe Scandura to Ray Sendker back to Scandura. The play covered 79 yards. Gow School defeated Park's varsity and middle school soccer teams, 1-0, and 4-0, respectively. Havergal College of Toronto conquered Park's girls' junior varsity and varsity field hockey teams, 1-0 and 2-1.

### PARK SCHOOL ENDS 3D UNBEATEN YEAR IN 6-MAN FOOTBALL

Park School of Buffalo's six-man football team finished its third straight undefeated season by scoring a 35-to-20 victory over Our Lady of Victory in Lackawanna's Civic Stadium Friday. It was the first night six-man game ever played in the immediate Buffalo area and drew more than 1000 persons.

It was the 24th game without a loss and the seventh win this season for Coach Herb Mol's Park team. Terry Cheek scored Park's first touchdown on a 40-yard run, then passed to three others—a 20-yard payoff loss to Dan Pantera, another to Ted Okie on a 70-yard pass-play and finally a 1-yard aerial to Okie. Frank Soldwedel raced 55 yards for Park's other score.

OLV's pass-duo of Bill Kirsh-to-Gene Boechel accounted for two touchdowns and an extra point while Norm Evancho plunged a yard for a six-pointer and passed to Kirsh for a point.

Snyder, Oct. 28—The Park School 6-man football team continued undefeated for the season and stretched their winning streak to 22 games by defeating Pebble Hill School of Syracuse 26-6 in a CUPS league game. The win was the third in league competition; the game this coming Saturday with Lakemont Academy will determine whether Park will retain the Rolling Stone Cup.

The scoring was opened in the first period by Frank Soldwedel on a 7-yard plunge. A Terry Cheek to Soldwedel pass was good for the extra point. In the second period, Dan Pantera raced 36 yards, followed by another Soldwedel plunge of 6 yards to lead at half-time, 20-0. A 76-yard pass-lateral play from Joe Scandura to Ray Sendker back to Scandura completed Park's scoring. A last period score by Dale Casto at the end of a drive engineered by Tom Zierk's passing was nullified by a penalty.

Park will close its season Friday night, Nov. 10, when it meets Our Lady of Victory at Lackawanna Stadium in the first 6-man football game under the lights in this area.
