

Park Gridders Win, Soccer Team Loses

The Park School 6-man football team bounced back from their win streak-breaking loss of last week to defeat Arcade Central School at Snyder, 27-20. This was the first game at home for the Pioneers this year, and will be followed next Saturday by a special homecoming day at which the soccer team will play at 11 A. M. and the football team at 2 P. M., the opponents in both cases being Lakemont Academy, a CUPS rival.

Arcade broke the scoring ice last Friday when a Dave Owens to Dave Bantle pass clicked for 19 yards and a touchdown. Park returned the next kickoff the entire distance, the drive carrying over into the second period and climaxed by Dale Casto's 1 yard plunge. A Casto to Joe Scandurra pass was good for the PAT. Joe Scandurra soon after took off on a 45-yard scoring jaunt after which Casto drop-kicked a two point PAT. Just before the half, Tom Zierk found Len Gross in the clear and a score resulted with the half ending 21-6 in favor of Park.

Dave Owens again broke the ice in the second half with a 55-yard reverse. In the last period Len Liotti finished the scoring for Park with a 6-yard plunge. On the next kick-off Arcade's scatback, Dave Owens, ran back 65 yards for the last score. The game ended with Park again driving but 8 yards short of the TD.

Soccer Team Loses to Harley

The soccer team visited Rochester on Friday, and threw a scare into the defending champions, Harley, as John Clark's goal gave the Pioneers a 1-0 lead at halftime. Harley, however, found their scoring punch in the last period as they counted three times for the victory. The soccer team now has a 2-3 record for the German AC trophy.

Park will be presented the Yale Club Trophy, the CUPS grid championship award, at a later date. The new trophy was placed into competition yesterday, following an announcement by Seymour H. Knox, president of the Yale Club of Western New York.

Joe Scandurra and Tom Zierk paced Park against Lakemont. Each scored two touchdowns. Scandurra raced 26 yards for one and plunged one yard for another. Zierk bagged his brace on sweeps of 12 and six yards.

Scandurra also gave Park a safety by crashing through to tackle a Lakemont back in the end zone. Dale Costa passed to Len Gross for Park's only successful conversion.

Lakemont's touchdowns came on Don Pinckney's 65-yard sprint with

a fumble, and Jerry Ames' four-yard pass to Pete Albright.

Lakemont defeated Park in soccer, 4-1. Dave Bunis scored Park's lone goal. The Tan brothers sparked Lakemont, Leong tallying three times and Juan once.

Win Over Lakemont Gains CUPS Crown For Park Gridmen

With Joe Scandurra and Tom Zierk each scoring twice, Park School's six-man grid team Friday defeated visiting Lakemont Academy, 27 to 14, to win its fourth straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools football championship.

Coach Herb Mols' Park team, undefeated in five league games this season, will receive a trophy from the Yale Club of Western New York. Seymour H. Knox, Yale Club president, said the cup will be retired after three victories.

Scandurra opened the scoring on a 26-yard touchdown run on the second play from scrimmage and Dale Casto passed to Len Gross for the extra point. Soon after, Scandurra, Ray Sendker and Len Liotti tackled Lakemont's Ron Gundry in his own end zone for a safety. Zierk scored in the second quarter on a 6-yard run after Liotti's 22-yard dash set it up.

Lakemont scored in the second quarter when Don Pinckney grabbed a loose ball and raced 65 yards for a touchdown and Jerry Ames, captain of last year's Kenmore High cage team, passed to Gundry for the extra point.

A pass-lateral play from Zierk to Sendker to Zierk good for 19 yards and Liotti's 11-yard dash set up Scandurra's 1-yard touchdown plunge in the third quarter. Lakemont bounced back to score on a 40-yard pass from Ames to Pete Albright and Ames passed to Bob Gronert for the extra point. Zierk scored in the final quarter on a 10-yard end sweep.

Park's soccer team was defeated, 4 to 1, by Lakemont's booters. Dave Bunis scored Park's goal. Lakemont will meet Harley Monday at Rochester for the championship.
