

Park School Receives Yale Trophy

PARK SCHOOL'S football team, champions of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools and other Park athletes were honored Thursday at a Sports Night dinner sponsored by the Fathers' Committee at the school's campus in North Harlem Rd., Snyder.

Highlight of the affair, attended by 132 persons, was the presentation of the Yale Football trophy to Co-captains Joseph Scandurra and Raymond Sendker by Henry Z. Urban, secretary-treasurer of the

Yale Alumni Association of Western New York and association-member Harold T. Clement Jr.

Under the direction of Coach Herb Mols, Park has won the CUPS football championship four years in a row. Park's 27-game victory streak was snapped by Our Lady of Victory Academy, 13 to 12, in a nonleague game at Lackawanna on Oct. 20.

There were three basketball games between the junior grades in the afternoon along with a wrestling clinic conducted by Chuck Bryant, University of Buf-

falo coach, and Bob Wilson, Niagara District AAU wrestling chairman.

The alumni of the Class of 1950 presented a cup to Coach Mols, and he, in turn, allocated it to Terry Finnell, winner of the campus cross-country run. The trophy will be on display at the school.

Dale Casto Sr., chairman of the Fathers' Committee gave a report and Ed Peterson and Al Dekdebrun, former Cornell athletes, were principal speakers. Rev. J. Blakeslee Lyon, minister of South Presbyterian Church, was toastmaster.

Park Lagers Open Cup Season, Win 3

The Park School basketball team opened its Conference of Upstate Private Schools play with a twin win in Rochester. The opening game was played at Harley school and both Junior and Varsity squads came off with wins, the JV's winning 34 to 10 as Dave Lyon with 10 and Clay Smith with 7 led scorers. The Varsity followed up this game by rushing to a 32-16 lead in the first half and then coasted to a 47-42 win as reserves played out the game. The following day, Park was entertained by Allendale School, also in Rochester. The Allendale J. V.'s valled in the last two minutes to eke out a 32-26 win. Dave Lyon with 11 and Charlie Keeler with 8 led the Park scorers. In the varsity contest, Park met its severest test. Allendale led 10-9 at the first quarter as Park had difficulty with the large court. The tight defensive play continued in the second quarter which ended at 16 all. Finally in the last half, Park began to fast break with the margin gradually building up to the final 42-32 score. Ray Sendker's work in rebounding and his 16 points, along with Terry Finnell's side sets for 11 points led the Pioneers.
