

Park Loses First Cups Tilt; Drops to Tie for First

Park School entertained Allendale School of Rochester last Friday on its Snyder court and was dealt its first CUPS League and Cornell CUP defeat. Park's record of 3 wins and 1 loss ties it with Allendale and Lakemont Academy as the halfway mark is approached. Behind 34-29 at the end of the half, Park spurred to tie the score and then forge ahead 49-47 at the third quarter. They widened this margin to 6 points in the last quarter, when the loss of Ray Sendker, and being outscored from the foul line 7-2, gave Allendale the tie at 56-56. With 2 minutes remaining, George Nichols of Allendale tallied on a break, and then they attempted to freeze the ball. They added two more foul shots, before Len Liotti intercepted and scored a push shot from the foul line. An attempt to score failed just as the gun went off, final score 60-58. The Jay Vee's evened their account with Allendale also by winning 31-26. Thus both games reversed the results of two weeks ago at Allendale. Dave Lyon again led the team with 14 points. Summary:
