

## DALE CASTRO SETS SCORING RECORD FOR PARK SCHOOL

Dale Castro set a Park School individual scoring record as Park defeated Harley School of Rochester, 46 to 42, Tuesday on the Snyder team's court. Castro, who still has a game against Nichols on Saturday ahead, netted 18 points to send his season total to 204, 17 better than the old mark established by Ted Okie. The game was Park's finale in Conference of Upstate Private Schools play and gave the team a league record of six victories and four defeats.

## Park Cagers Split On Week End Trip

Park School's basketball team made its annual winter trek into Central New York and returned with an even split in games played. On Thursday night Park gained victories over Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 32-20 in the JV contest and 69-58 in the varsity game. The next day they were defeated at Lakemont Academy 49-18 and 62-44 by the defending champions. By these victories, Lakemont assumed a clear lead for the Cornell Cup with a record of 7-1, while Park dropped into third place with a 5-3 record, each with two games to play.

Don Wallens and Bob Wilson led the JVs against Pebble Hill with 10 and 6 points respectively. The varsity took a commanding 23-10 lead in the first quarter and was never pressed in gaining its 5th victory in CUPS play. Ray Sendker with 14 and Terry Fennel with 12 led the scoring which was well distributed among all players.

## Park Defeats Neumann, Loses to DeVeaux

Park School broke even in basketball action the past week as it squared the season records with victory over Neumann which avenged a previous defeat, while losing to DeVeaux at Niagara Falls reversed an earlier season win of Park.

On Tuesday, Park visited Neumann of Williamsville and hung on to win 69-68 as Neumann's late last period drive fell one point short. The game had been close all the way with each team taking turns at the lead. With about three minutes remaining, Park had moved into its most substantial lead of the game by 8 points. Ed Wosniak and Ken Harris each dropped in 2 baskets against 2 by Ray Sendker to cut the lead by 4, and then Dick Schanley went all the way for a basket. With 15 seconds remaining, Len Liotti made a foul shot and as the game ended, Wosniak scored once more from the side to make the final read 69-68. Ray Sendker led all scorers with 30 points which established a new record for a Park player, while Dale Castro and Ed Wosniak each had 22. In the JV game, Neumann won 58-51, as Charlie Pelcin with 15 and Jack Berger and Adam Wetzel with 14 each, led Neumann.
