

Park School Takes CUPS Track Meet

Park School of Buffalo won the Conference of Upstate Private Schools track meet yesterday afternoon over the Allendale School cinder path.

The Windy City runners amassed a total of 142½ points in

the combined senior and junior program. Allendale School spikemen finished second with 128; Lakemont Academy was third with 65; Harley School compiled 32, and Pebble Hill of Syracuse had 25½.

In senior competition, John Logan of Allendale annexed the pole vault and broad jump, and placed second in the 220-yard dash.

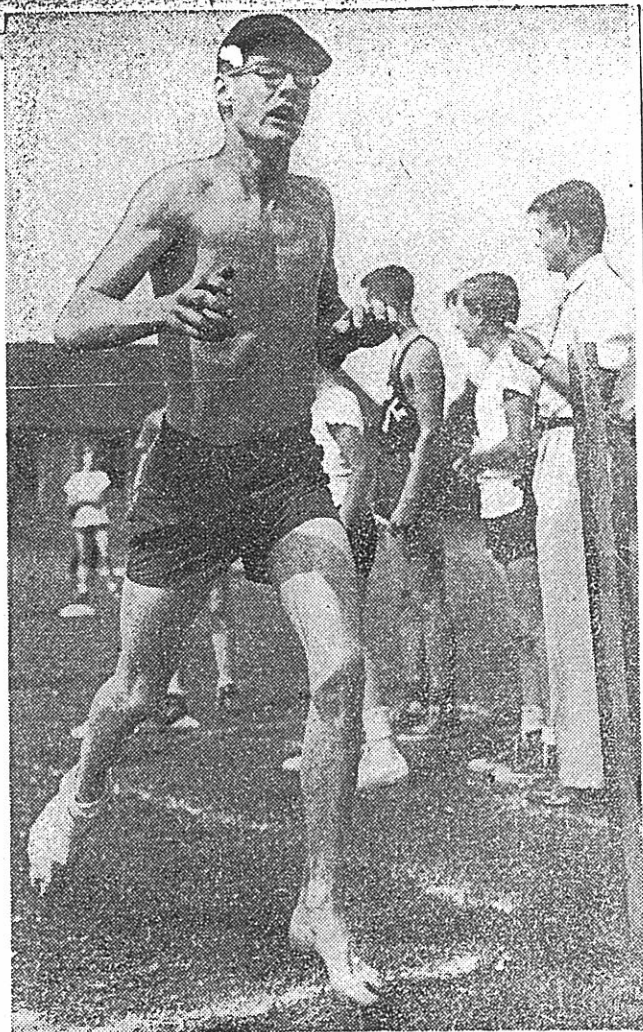
