

Park Regains First in Race for Dartmouth Cup

On Wednesday, Park School visited DeVeau School of Niagara Falls and by winning 7 to 1, moved back into 1st place in the CUPS League baseball race for the Dartmouth cup. Dale Casto pitched hitless ball for 6 of the 7 innings and only in the 4th inning when he was touched for 2 singles and a walk was he in any danger. He struck out 10 and handled 4 chances from the box. For the first 3 innings, Park advanced men to 3rd where they died. In the 5th, Dave Bunis' double plated the first score after which singles by Karl Heilborn, Tom Zierk and Casto scored twice more.

Ron Bell drove in a run the next inning while another rally in the 7th with key blows by Casto and Howie Maierhofer added 3 more runs to sew up the verdict. The Pioneers now have won 3 and lost 1 in CUPS play with one game remaining at Park next Tuesday.

Again in the 6th, a walk and an error produced a Nichols run to tie the score. An attempted steal home was called out and thus ended Park's last threat. In the 8th, Park just missed a double play which when followed by another centerfield

error plated the tie-breaking run and Pete Taggart singled to score an insurance run. It was Nichols' 1st win over Park since 1948.

Park Track Team 2d In CUPS Meet

Rochester, May 23—Allendale, of Rochester, won the Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championship for a second straight year today by nipping Park School, of Snyder, 168¾ to 166¾.

Harley, of Rochester, was third with 31¼ points, followed by Pebble Hill, Syracuse, 24¼, and DeVeaux, Niagara Falls, 4.

Three Park athletes—Terry Finnell, Tom Zierk and Dale Casto—turned in outstanding performances.

Finnell set two CUPS and school records. He established his marks in the mile, 4:58.5, and the high jump, 5 feet seven inches.

Zierk copped the 100 and 220, ran the opening leg of Park's victorious 880 relay team, and finished third in the broad jump.

Casto won the discus, ran the anchor leg for the relay team, and took second in the half and third in the 100.

Two other Park boys set CUPS marks in the junior competition. They are John Reissig, shot put, and Bob Wilson, pole vault.

Rochester, May 28—Officials of Allendale School of Rochester announced today that Park School of Buffalo has been declared winner of the annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championships staged here last Saturday.

Allendale was first named the meet victor, 168¾ to 166¾. A check today revealed that an Allendale athlete had competed in too many events. Three points were awarded to the Buffalo school as a result of the ineligibility, thereby giving Park School the meet championship, 169¾ to 165¾.

Allendale officials have forwarded a letter to Park School authorities advising them of the change in the title award.

PARK TEAM PLACES 2D IN CONFERENCE TRACK MEET AGAIN

ROCHESTER, May 25. — Terry Finnell set two Conference of Upstate Private Schools records in the senior class competition while John Reissig and Bob Wilson established league marks in the junior division Saturday as Park School's track team finished second to champion Allendale School of Rochester in the CUPS Track and Field Meet.

Allendale amassed 168¾ points to Park's 166¾ while Harley School of Rochester had 31¼ followed by Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 24¼, and DeVeaux of Niagara Falls, 4.

Finnell set CUPS and Park School marks with a 4:58.5 mile and a leap of 5 feet and 7 inches in the high jump. Reissig set a CUPS junior standard of 41 feet 2½ inches in the shot-put and Wilson's pole-vault mark was 8 feet 9¼ inches.

Park's Tom Zierk won the senior 100- and 220-yard dashes and ran the opening leg of the victorious 880-yard relay team. Park's Dale Casto won the discus and ran the anchor leg on the relay team.
