

## PARK TRACKMEN DEFEAT CANISIUS, ST. JOE ATHLETES

Tom Zierk won the 220-yard dash and the broad jump as Park School's track team Friday swept all but one of the field events in defeating Canisius, 75 to 39, in a triangular meet at Park. St. Joe was third with 21 points. Jack Dunnigan, Canisius half-miler, won the 100 and established a track record of 2:14 in the 880. The winners follow:

## Park School Wins Triangular Meet

Park School piled up 75 points to defeat Canisius and St. Joe's in a triangular track and field meet yesterday at Park. Canisius finished second with 39 points to 21 for St. Joe's.

Tom Zierk was the top point-getter for Park. In addition to winning the 220 and the broad jump, Zierk was second in the high jump, second in the 100 and ran with the victorious relay team.

Jack Dunnigan was a double winner for Canisius, finishing first in the 100 and 880. He set a track record of 2:14 in the latter event. Dunnigan also holds the Park track marks for the 440 and the mile.

## PARK SCHOOL EDGED BY ALLENDALE

Allendale School of Rochester defended its Syracuse Cup successfully Saturday by winning the CUPS League Track and Field Championship at Rochester. Allendale won by the narrow margin of 168 3/4 to Park's 166 3/4 followed by Harley School of Rochester 31 1/4, Pebble Hill of Syracuse 24 1/4 and DeVeaux of Niagara Falls, 4. In the CUPS meet, the athletes compete in either the Junior Class (under 16) or Senior Class (over 16). Five places count in points as follows, 8-5-3-2-1.

Bob Wilson started Park off in its quest for its 5th title by winning the Junior hurdles and Park led right up until the 2nd last event of the day which Allendale swept for 19 points, namely the Senior Shot Put. Park and Allendale split exactly even in the pole vault events and thus Allendale gained its second leg on the Cup by the narrowest margin in the history of the league. John DeKieweit of Allendale led his Junior forces with the only triple win of the day when he won the discus, high jump, and 440 as well as anchoring a winning relay team. George Nichols sparked his senior team by winning the 880, broad jump and a second in the 100 as well as anchor of his relay team which placed second to Park.

Of the Park Juniors, Bob Wilson won the hurdles and set a record in the pole vault as well as 4th in the high jump and a relay leg. Dick Detrick won the 50, took seconds in the 100 and broad jump and ran a relay leg, while Joe Bell had seconds in the 50 and 440 and a 5th in the high jump. Howie Maierhofer won the 50 and then pulled a muscle on the last turn of the 440 to render a blow to Park's chances. John Reissig broke the Junior shot record and took 3rd in the discus.

In the seniors, Tom Zierk romped off with the 100, 220 and 3rd in the broad jump while leading off the relay team. Dale Casto won the discus, took 2nd in the 880 and 3rd in the 100 and anchored the winning relay team. Terry Finnell broke CUPS records and established Park School records in the mile and high jump.

Park's athletic season ends this week when the baseball team entertains DeVeaux at Snyder on Tuesday at 4 and travels to Gow School Saturday. The track team plays host to Canisius Friday at Park at 3:30 P. M.

## PARK AWARDED CUPS TRACK TITLE

Albert Alsmansberger, athletic director at Allendale School of Rochester, and CUPS track chairman this year announced that a review of the track results of the annual meet held Saturday, May 23, disclosed that Allendale had violated a CUPS rule by allowing more than two field events per athlete. The violation had been completely unintentional and was only discovered when summaries were being prepared. By voiding these points, it was computed that Park School had regained the Syracuse Cup, 166 to 165 for Allendale. Park has now won this trophy 5 of the last 6 years.

On Friday, May 29, at the Park campus, the trackmen completed their season by defeating Canisius and St. Joe's in a triangular meet. Park had 75 to Canisius 39 to St. Joe's 21. Jack Dunnigan of Canisius set the only track record in winning the half mile in 2:14 over a very heavy track. This adds to the mile and quarter records which he has set in the past two records. He also won the 100 and placed third in the broad jump.

## Baseball Team Splits in Week's Play

On Thursday, May 28, Park completed its CUPS league play by dropping a return game with DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls, 12 to 8. Both teams thus dropped into a tie for second place with a mathematical chance for 1st place should Allendale lose its final game. DeVeaux jumped to a 7-0 lead in the first 2 innings until Don Lischer stepped in to stop the rally. Despite later rallies by the Pioneers, errors permitted DeVeaux to add the insurance tallies to win. Don Barker led the DeVeaux hitters with 3 safe blows while Zierk had 3 for Park.

On Saturday, May 30, Park completed its season by visiting Gow School for their annual Dad's Day game and pulling off a 6-5 win which brought the season record to won 4 and lost 3.
