

PARK GRIDDERS RECORD 66 POINTS IN 4TH STRAIGHT WIN

NIAGARA FALLS, Oct. 10.—The Park School all-time football scoring records established by Terry Cheek fell Friday as the Snyder school's touchdown twins, Tom Zierk and Dale Casto, paced the team to a 66-to-33 victory here. It was Park's fourth straight win and second in Conference of Upstate Private Schools competition.

Zierk scored five touchdowns on kickoff returns, three of 50, 60 and 65 yards; one on a 35-yard return of a pass interception and another on a 24-yard run.

Casto scored on a 65-yard run, dropkicked two conversions for four points and passed to Harry Nichols and Don Lischer for two more points. Ron Bell scored twice on runs of 36 and 20 yards and Dave Lyon also scored twice, one on a 38-yard run.

DeVeaux scored as Buffalo's Roger Penny ran 19 yards and plunged for the extra point. Lloyd Schrack passed to Pete Kallas and Kallas ran for another tally. Pete Mansour went over for two tallies on runs of 10 yards each.

Park Clinches Tie For CUPS Title

Syracuse, Oct. 17.—Park School clinched a tie for the CUPS six man football championship today by slamming Pebble Hill, 69-25.

Dale Casto set a Park School single game scoring mark by tallying four touchdowns and kicking four extra points.

John Reissig and Tom Zierk scored two TDs each. Dave Lyon and Harry Nichols added single tallies for Park's other touchdowns.

ZIERK, CASTRO LEAD PARK TO WIN 4TH

Last Friday the Park Pioneers football team continued its winning streak by scoring its fourth straight and second straight in CUPS play as they romped over DeVeaux School, 66-33, at Niagara Falls. Sparking the play again were the co-captains Dale Castro & Tom Zierk, who as a result of their scoring today moved into the 1-2 positions in all-time Park scoring records, eclipsing the old record of 171 points made by Terry Cheek, now a sophomore halfback at Harvard.

Zierk opened the scoring in the first quarter with his 50 yard dash with the opening kickoff and a 35 yard run with an intercepted pass. He opened the 2nd quarter with a 24 yard jaunt into paydirt, another 65 yard kickoff return and a duplicate of this in the 3rd quarter. Castro drop-kicked the extra points in the first quarter, threw two other PAT passes to Harry Nichols and Don Lischer and galloped 65 yards with the pigskin for another TD. Dave Lyon and Ron Bell entered the scoring parade with two touchdowns apiece.

DeVeaux scoring was led by Pete Mansour who tallied 2 TD's and a PAT run, while Lloyd Schrack threw one to Pete Kallas who later added another 40 yard sprint. Roger Penny tallied on a 19 yard sprint and Penny, Schrack and Kallas added PAT runs.

The Pioneers thus move into the lead for the Yale Trophy which they had relinquished last year for the first time since 1947.

At the same time, an underdog soccer eleven was playing all out to try to stop the high-scoring DeVeaux team but was unable to overcome a first period goal by Victor Erminy and thus went down to its second CUPS defeat 1-0. DeVeaux moves into undisputed first place with a 3-0 record as the clubs move into the second round.

The Middle School soccer team continued undefeated by dropping DeVeaux 4-1 as Tim Fimmel again led the junior Pioneers by scoring 3 goals just as he had done last Wednesday when they defeated Nichols 3-0. Roger Hooker scored the other goal.

Next week Friday, the Park soccer team travels to Harley School of Rochester while the football team journeys to Pebble Hill of Syracuse for a Saturday game. After this game, the team will move on to Ithaca to watch the Yale-Cornell game.

PARK FOOTBALL TEAM CLINCHES TROPHY

Park School's football team coached by Herb Mols clinched its fifth championship in the last six years in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools by trouncing Pebble Hill at Syracuse 69-25. It was the fifth straight win for the Pioneers this year and again it was co-captains Tom Zierk and Dale Casto who led the scoring parade. Both boys have broken the career scoring record as of last week, and this week Zierk posted a single year high which also erased one of Terry Cheek's records from the books. Casto set a new dropkick for PAT's record when he connected for four, eclipsing the old record of three which had been done eight times. In addition, Casto chalked up four touchdowns which totaled 32 points and a new single game scoring record topping Zierk's record of one week ago of 30 points. Finally, the team score of 69 was the highest in Park history. Park thus gains a second leg on the Yale trophy.

Park set out to avenge its first defeat by Pebble Hill of last year when John Reissig blocked a punt and scooted 30 yards for the score. He later picked up another fumble and ran 15 yards for another score. Casto scored on runs of 20, 46, 52 and 22 yards in addition to tossing a PAT pass to Harry Nichols. The latter added a touchdown on a 10 yard pass from Zierk, who also raced 60 and 20 yards for TD's in addition to several other runs which set up other scores.

Jack Branin pitched two scores for the home team, one to Chuck Beeler and the other to Bill Hoffman. Kem Branin scored on a 12 yard run and Jon Joiner recovered his team's fumble in the end zone for the last score.

At the same time, the soccer team visited Harley School and had an earlier decision reversed when the Rochester team won out 3-1 as Howie Maierhofer was the only Pioneer able to dent the opponent's goal. DeVeaux, by winning at Allendale, was thus able to clinch the German A. C. Cup even though all schools still have two games remaining. Park was the defending champion. In four years of play for this cup, four different schools have now won the trophy.

Next week's activity is limited to a soccer game at Nichols.

The girls were more successful at Harley as they scored a 2-0 win on Lynn Morree's goals. The field hockey team will meet with Amherst on Monday and then travel to Havergal College on Saturday for the annual game in Toronto.

Park 11 Breaks Records With 69 Points

SYRACUSE, Oct. 19.—Park School clinched at least a tie for the Conference of Upstate Private Schools football crown Saturday by conquering Pebble Hill, 69 to 25, here as the Pioneers shattered both the league and school scoring records.

The 69 points is a new high for both the league and Park, and Casto's 32 points on four touchdowns and four dropkicks also better by two the school mark set by Tom Zierk last week.

Zierk broke Terry Cheek's school career scoring record by tallying twice, on dashes of 60 and 20 yards, to run his total to 108 points. Casto's runs were for 20, 22, 46 and 52 yards. Casto passed to Harry Nichols for an extra point while Zierk pitched a 10-yard scoring

pass to the same Nichols. Dave Lyon scored on a 60-yard run and John Reissig blocked a kick and ran 30 yards and scored on a 15-yard run for additional Park TDs.
