This was the 4th clean slate in 6 years for the Pioneers. At the same time, the soccer team was avenging an earlier season defeat by dropping the previously unbeaten DeVeaux soccer team

The football team won its 7th straight as the departing seniors, Dale Casto, Tom Zierk and Harry Nichols led the way again. On the first play from scrimmage for Park, Tom Zierk raced 47 yards for the score as Casto dropkicked the PAT. In the second period the attack began to roll as Zierk climaxed a drive with a short pass to Ron Bell again followed by Casto's successful dropkick. Two more drives resulted in Casto plunging for 2 scores from the 3 and 6 yard lines. In the third period, Casto tossed a short pass to Dave Lyon who raced 30 more yards, while in the last raced 30 more yards, while in the last period Casto tossed a screen pass to Zierk for a 22 yard play and the final
