

PARK WINS 2ND CUPS

Last Friday, following a busy examination week, Park School basketball team traveled to Syracuse to play their annual games with Pebble Hill School in DeWitt and garnered a couple of victories over their CUPS rivals. Using a two platoon system for the first time this year, the varsity gained an early lead with Bob Wilson setting the pace and scoring 18 points. Dave Colton led the second group with 19 points and this group managed to hold their own in the second and fourth quarters. The Pioneers led at halftime 38-26 and upped the margin to 85-60 by game's end. Ken Branin with 20 and Gerry Grassman with 19 led the home team. Park thus moved into 2nd place in the CUPS play with a 2-1 record and has 4-4 overall.
