## Park School Posts 64-58 Win, Takes Loop Lead

ROCHESTER, Feb. 12.—The Park School of Buffalo took over the top spot in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools circuit today by rallying in the final period and beating Allendale School, 64-58.

The triumph gave Park School a league record of five wins and one loss, Allendale, which was league co-champion with Park last season, was undefeated in four games until today.

Allendale took an 11-2 lead early in the game. Park then began to move, was behind by three points after the first period and one point after the half and third quarter.

Bob Wilson and Larry Biggie netted two field goals each for Park School at the outset of the final period. The teams traded points until 25 seconds of time remained, when Don O'Brian pumped a foul and Allendale tied the score at 58.

Wilson then netted a field goal

and two foul shots and closed the scoring for Park. Wilson and Biggie set the scoring pace for Park with 23 and 31 points, respectively. O'Brian led Allendale with 22. Mike Millard added 18.

### PARK WIN STREAK GOES TO FIVE

Last Saturday, Park resumed CUPS basketball play and made its record 3-1, as it defeated DeVeaux School at Niagara Falls, 78-57, for its fifth straight win of the present campaign. Starting off slowly as the first shots were rimming the basket, the Pioneers finally found the range toward the end of the first quarter to take a 21-13 lead as Don Wallens and Joe Bell each caged a pair. DeVeaux continued to snipe at the lead and reduced the margin to 35-31 by halftime. In the third quarter, Bob Wilson and Dave Lyon dropped in short jumps to open up the zone defense and win going away. Joe Bell, with 18, and Wilson, with 17, led the Park scorers, while Pete Kallas was high for the game with 20. Larry Biggie missed his first foul shot in five games; his streak having gone to nine straight.

The JV's dropped a 39-20 decision, Fred Crofts having 11 for DeVeaux and Tom Barker, seven for Park.

Last Wednesday, in a return game at Park, Neumann High dropped a 57-50 decision to even the score for the year. The game was nip and tuck throughout the first half as neither team was able to crack the defenses set up, although Don Wallens entered the game in the second quarter to drop in three driving layups and reduce the margin to 22-21 at half-time.

Larry Biggie and Wallens continued to hit in the third quarter, to open up a margin which Park maintained to the end. Denny Morrissey led all scorers with 21, while Bob Wilson was high for Park with 17.

The Park JV's gained a 34-32 win as Barry Cave, made a couple foul shots in the last couple seconds, to put Park ahead for the first time and win. He was high with 18, while Burt Ungrer led the Neumannites with 13.

### Park Sweeps Rochester Schools, Takes Lead

Park School traveled to Rochester last week end to engage its CUPS rivals in basketball and for the first time since 1952 and second time in league history emerged with a double win, dropping Harley 80-51 on Friday night and Allendale 64-58 on Saturday morning. The latter win avenged an early season defeat and moved Park into a half-game lead over Allendale with whom it shared the championship a year ago. Park leads in the Cornell Cup chase with a 5-1 record while Allendale is now 4-1.

Last Wednesday, Park traveled to Batavia High School for a return engagement and dropped an 82-50 decision to a much improved team.

Park returns to Snyder for its next CUPS game with Pebble Hill of Syracuse on Friday night, Feb. 18.
