

## PARK WINS SIXTH STRAIGHT CUPS CONTEST

Last Friday night Park School returned to its home hardwood and leveled Pebble Hill School of Syracuse 74-29, for its sixth straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools victory. The Green clad visitors decided upon a possession game and the first shot of the game was not taken for 1½ minutes. However, the speedy Snyder team was not to be held back long and soon forged to a 19-5 lead at quarter time. Second stringers raised the ante to 35-17 and the regulars romped to a 32-1 margin in the third before giving way to reserves. Bob Wilson led the scorers with 20, Larry Biggie had 16 and Dave Lyon 15 for Park, while Kem Branin was high with 8 for the visitors. In the freshman game with Williamsville, Park gained a 40-23 win as Tim Finnell caged 13 while Pat Wyatt was high for the Billies with 8.

In the afternoon, the Park middle schoolers reversed their only loss and dropped the Nichols team for their first loss, 23-30. Park's record is now 6-1. Steve Cary and Jerry Jacobstein split 16 for Park.

Next Friday Park will complete its CUPS schedule when it meets the Harley School of Rochester at Snyder at 7:30 P. M. The final game will be March 1 when Nichols visits Park for a return engagement.

## Park Clinches Tie For CUPS Title With 73-46 Win

The Park School clinched at least a tie for the Conference of Upstate Private Schools basketball championship by beating Harley School of Rochester, 73-46, in the final league game of the season yesterday.

Park closed its loop campaign with a 7-1 record. Allendale School of Rochester, which shared the Cornell Cup with Park last season, presently has a 4-1 record and three games to go. Park's overall season record is 10-5.

Forward Bob Wilson and center Joe Bell set the scoring pace for Park by hitting for 17 and 16, respectively. Bill Whiting netted 13 for Harley.

## NICHOLS DEFEATS PARK SCHOOL, PLAYS ST. JOE TEAM NEXT

The Nichols School basketball team will bid for its sixth victory against eight defeats when it plays St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute in St. Joe's Kenmore gym Friday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock.

Nichols, which had lost two overtime games this season, downed the Park School, 70-65, in an extra-period battle Monday afternoon at Snyder. The victory avenged the Big Green's 54-50 defeat by Park at Nichols Jan. 18.

## Nichols Quint Defeats Park in Overtime, 70-65

Nichols School scored five points in the three-minute overtime period while holding Park scoreless yesterday to gain a 70-65 basketball decision at Park.

Walt Hoffman caged a basket and two free throws and Jerry Burns added a charity toss to account for the winners' extra-period points.

Bob Wilson's free throw, with three seconds remaining, tied the game at 65-65 in regulation time.

Although he played only two quarters, Bob Wilson sustained a severe sprain in this last ten seconds of play and may be lost for the Pioneers last home game, rescheduled at Park on Monday, with Nichols. Bob would have approached this last game with a chance to erase the single season record established by Dale Casto last year, although he will have set a new average per game mark. Park has now won 9 of its last 10 games to emerge with a 10-5 overall record.

## PARK LOSES FINALE IN OVERTIME

In an overtime thriller, Park dropped its final game of the season to Nichols School, 70-65, and thereby ended a fairly successful season with a won-10-and-lost-6 record. Five of the losses came in the first six games.

The CUPS champions were slow to get moving, being down 20-15 at quarter and 39-30 at half-time. Midway through the third period, Park picked up the pace and from a 14-point deficit, they raced to a 52-all tie at the start of the fourth period. The team then traded baskets until the three-minute period, when Park again went ahead, after holding the ball for over two minutes. Nichols came back with a three-pointer and, with three seconds left, Bob Wilson scored the tying point in the first of two foul shots. However, in overtime, Walt Hoffman, high scorer with 27, made a bucket and two fouls, to give the Green their victory.

Larry Biggie with 16 and Seniors Joe Bell, with 16, and Bob Wilson, with 15, were high for Park. Playing only the latter part of the game, due to a sprained ankle, Wilson nevertheless managed his total to bring him to 300 for the season, just three shy of the all-time record for a season, made by Dale Casto, but the average of 18.7 was a new record. In addition to the above two seniors, Co-captains Don Wallens and Dave Lyon, Ron Bell and John Clark completed their careers for the Orange.
