

### NICHOLS WINS TRACK MEET

Ray Empson won three events and set two meet records this afternoon in leading host Nichols to a lopsided victory in the Invitation Track and Field Meet at Nichols Field.

Winning ten of the 12 events, Nichols piled up 93 1/2 points. Park School of Snyder was second with 32 1/2, Lakemont, N. Y., Academy third with 5 and Allendale School of Rochester fourth with 2.

Empson, a 16-year-old junior, won the 100- and 220-yard dashes and the running broad jump. He set meet records of :24.2 in the 220 and 19 feet 7 3/4 inches in the broad jump. Wyn Eaton set a meet record of 10 feet 6 inches in the pole vault. Other winners were:

### PARK SCHOOL PLACES 2ND IN INVITATION TRACK MEET

Park School's track and field team opened its season by placing second to the hosts at the 5th annual Nichols invitational track meet last Saturday. The Buffalo team romped to its largest margin as it garnered 92 points to Park's 32, Lakemont Academy 5 and Allendale School of Rochester 2. Because of inclement training weather this spring, the visitors brought only token squads, and he well-balanced Green team blanketed most of the events.

The feature events of the day saw Ray Empson of Nichols edge Tom Zierk of Park by inches in the 100 yard dash and the broad jump, and by 10 feet in the 220. Meet records were either tied or broken in all three events. The other meet record went to Wyn Eaton of Nichols as he reached 10 ft. 6 in. in the pole vault. Zierk led off for the victorious 880 yard relay team which included Phil Tschopp, Dick Detrick and Dale Casto. The latter added a 4th place in the 880 and a 1st place in the discus of 113 ft. 7 in. Detrick placed 3rd in the 440, while Dave Stewart placed 2nd in the mile. Bob Wilson and Clay Smith finished 3, 4 in the 110 hurdles and Smith added a 4th in the pole vault. Dave Lyon placed tie for 2nd in the pole vault also. Joe Bell added a 4th in the 100 to complete Park's scoring.

This week, Park and Pine Hill will engage in baseball at Pine Hill on Tuesday and a track meet at Snyder on Thursday. The Pioneers travel to Syracuse to open the CUPS baseball chase for the Dartmouth Cup on Saturday.

### Park School Tops Pebble Hill, 7-1

Syracuse, May 1—Park School of Buffalo opened its baseball season yesterday by defeating Pebble Hill School, 7-1. Right-hander Don Lischer pitched a three-hitter for Park.

Lischer, a sophomore who gained all CUPS honors last season, fanned seven and issued only one walk.

In the fifth, Bib Wilson scored as Lischer squeezed him home and was scored by Zierk's double. In the seventh, a double by Tom Barker, walks to Wilson and Casto loaded the bases. A single by Dave Colton pushed across one run while Scott Wall's single scored two more to end the scoring.

Pebble Hill's only run came from a single and double by the Brannin brothers in the sixth.

Saturday, May 8, Park traveled to Rochester for the 7th annual CUPS track and field meet and returned home for the sixth time with the Syracuse cup. This year adds another leg to the present trophy and it is thereby retired permanently. Park won with 206 points, followed by Allendale with 132, Harley 27, Pebble Hill 16 and DeVeaux 15.

Tom Zierk was the only quadruple winner as he won both of the senior sprints, broke the broad jump record with a 19 ft. 6 1/2 in. effort, and ran on the winning Park relay team. He thus completed 4 years of victories in the sprints, 2 years in the Juniors and 2 in the Seniors. Bob Wilson broke the other record, the pole vault, as he also set a Park School record of 9 ft. 8 1/2 in. He also tied for 1st in the high jump and took second in the hurdles. Dale Casto defended his discus title, took second in the 880 and 3rd in the shot as well as anchoring the relay team. Clay Smith won the hurdles and tied for second in the pole vault. In the Juniors, Dick Detrick won the 440 and took seconds in the 50, and broad jump as well as anchoring the winning relay team. Dave Colton, Don Lischer and Bruce Eaton added wins in the hurdles, pole vault and broad jump. Doug Johnston and Steve Cary joined Colton and Detrick on the winning relay team.

### TWO PARK STARS SET RECORDS IN TRACK VICTORY

ROCHESTER, May 10.—Park School of Buffalo's Bob Wilson and Tom Zierk set records here Saturday to pace Coach Herb Mols' track team to the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) championship. Park scored 206 points to retire the Syracuse Cup a second time.

Wilson set a pole-vault mark of 9 feet 8 1/2 inches, Zierk a broad jump record of 19 feet 6 1/2 inches. Host Allendale tallied 132 points, Harley of Rochester 27, Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 16, and DeVeaux of Niagara Falls, 15. Other Park winners were:
