PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 10.—Dale Casto and Tom Zierk, two former four-sport stars at the Park School who grew up together in the same Snyder neighborhood, played on opposite teams Saturday when the Princeton frosh football team, defeated the Harvard frosh, 21-0.

Both Casto and Zierk are wing-backs. Casto, a Princeton alternate, scored on an 8-yard run as the climax of a drive in which he contributed several key runs. He also completed a long pass to put his team in scoring position.

Zierk started at wingback for Harvard but suffered an ankle injury just before halftime and didn't see action thereafter.
