

# Big Green Bags Easy Track Win

Ray Empson, captain of the Nichols School track team, set three meet records and ran the anchor lap on the 880-yard relay team, which also broke a mark, as the Big Green won its annual invitation meet yesterday.

Empson, a senior from Hamburg, won the 100, 220 and the broad jump, contributing to Nichols' total of 77½ points. Other meet records were set by two Nichols athletes, Giff Salisbury and Wyn Eaton, in the discus and pole vault.

Nichols was followed by Park School, 28½; Lakemont Academy, 16; Allendale and DeVeaux, 5 each.

Nichols opened its spring sports campaign at home Saturday, scoring a double victory. The Nichols varsity defeated an alumni baseball team, 8-6, and won its annual Invitation Track Meet with 77½ points. The Park School was second with 28½.

Nichols athletes set seven meet records. Ray Empson produced three of them and teamed with Bob Battel, Bob Jordan and Tom MacArthur for a meet mark of 1:38 in the 880-yard relay.

Empson's other records were: 10.4 seconds in the 100-yard dash; 23.6 in the 220; 19 feet 10½ inches in the broad jump. Other meet standards were: MacArthur, 14 in the 120-low hurdles; Wyn Eaton, 10 feet 7½ inches in the pole vault, and Gifford Salisbury, 121 feet 8½ inches in the discus throw. Park School's only winner was Dave Lyon, who took the 880 run in 2:18.9.

## Park Opens Sports Season by Placing 2nd In Invitation Meet

Park gained the runnerup spot among the five schools entered in the 7th annual Nichols invitation track meet held last Saturday by garnering 29 points to the host school's 77. Lakemont Academy had 16, Allendale 6 and DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls had 4 points. Ray Empson of Nichols led the record, shattering as he lowered the mark for the 100 to :10.4, the 220 to 23:6, the broad jump to 19' 10½" and anchored the winning relay team in a 1:38 half mile. Wyn Eaton raised his pole vault mark to 10' 7¼", Giff Salisbury made a new mark for the discus with 121' 8½" and Tom McArthur set a 120-yard low hurdles mark of :14.0.

Dave Lyon won the 880 for Park's only win. Bob Wilson took second in the pole vault in which he established a new Park record of 10' 1½" and the high jump, fourth in the hurdles and anchored the third place relay team. Freshman Tim Finnell placed third in the 880. Joe Bell had thirds in the dashes while Lars Pedersen placed second in the discus and fourth in the shot. John Reissig dashed to a fourth in the 100, took third in the shot and led off the relay team.

The baseball team will launch its 1955 season next week when it opens defense of the CUPS baseball championship by playing host to Allendale on Tuesday and Pebble Hill on Saturday. Neumann will be met in Williamsville on Thursday.
