

DALE CASTO NAMED BASEBALL CAPTAIN OF PRINCETON CLUB

PRINCETON, N. J., May 14.—Dale Casto of Snyder, N. Y., a former four-sport athlete at Park School, has been elected captain of Princeton University's freshman baseball team.



Casto plays third base, and has been hitting about .400. He has had eight hits in nine times at bat in his last two games. He collected four singles against Rutgers and hit a homer, triple and two singles against Columbia.

Casto, 19, was a reserve tailback on the Tigers' freshman football team last fall. At Park, Casto played six-man football, basketball, baseball and track.

Park Baseball Team Cops Opening Wins

The Park baseball team took advantage of the break in the weather last week to visit Rochester on Thursday and Saturday and to make a successful start of its defense of the Dartmouth Cup for Conference of Upstate Private Schools play. Allendale School was shut out by the fine, one-hit pitching of Don Lischer, righthanded junior. Don struck out 14 and walked only one and was deprived of a no-hitter by a pop fly by Dave Allen in the fifth next to the highfield line just out of reach of the fielders. His teammates played errorless ball as they gobbled up the easy infield taps. Allen's hit being the only ball to go out of the infield. Bob Wilson and Scott Walls each contributed a couple of hits to the attack while Ron Bell's single drove in two mates. Thirteen passes issued by the home pitchers contributed to the 13-run total amassed by the Pioneers. Line score:

On Saturday, Park repeated against Harley for a 17-1 romp. Larry Biggie made his inaugural start on the hill. The first Harley batter singled and eventually scored on a passed ball, but his teammates went down in order until the sixth when two singles and a walk loaded the bases, but they were left stranded as a strikeout and two pop flies retired the side. Biggie had 14 strikeouts and walked four. In the meantime Bob Wilson and Ron Bell were leading the hit attack as each connected for a single, double and triple cycle, driving in three and two runs apiece and icing the game with a five-run burst in the fourth. CONFERENCE MEET AT PARK SCHOOL SATURDAY MORNING

Because of the thruway, the ninth annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) Track & Field Championships will be held at Park School in Snyder Saturday morning at 11 o'clock.

"Before the building of the thruway," explained Park Athletic Director Herb Mols today, "CUPS members in Syracuse, for instance, thought a trip to Buffalo was too far. Now, they'll be coming to Snyder instead of Rochester to try to dethrone us!"

Park has won the CUPS' track crown six of the seven times it competed, twice retiring the Syracuse Alumni Trophy. "We didn't compete in the first meet because of a scarlet-fever quarantine at Park," Mols says.

Saturday's meet, comprising 27 events, will have senior, junior and midget divisions. Opposing Park will be Allendale and Harley Schools of Rochester, Pebble Hill of Syracuse and DeVeaux of Niagara Falls.

Dave Colton, making his first pitching start after being sidelined because of a leg injury, Friday hurled 1-hit baseball for six innings. Then he weakened, but Park School went on to defeat visiting Pebble Hill of Syracuse 10-7, in a Conference of Upstate Private Schools' game.
