

Park School Wins CUPS Track Title; Three Records Fall

The Park School of Snyder amassed a grand total of 219½ points and shattered three conference records as it easily won its third straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championship yesterday afternoon at the Park track.

Allendale School of Rochester followed Park with 121 7/10, DeVeaux of Niagara Falls trailed with 49½, Pebble Hill of Syracuse scored 20½, and Harley School of Rochester was last with 3½.

Bob Wilson and Lars Pedersen, each a double winner, established CUPS records in senior competition for Park, while teammate Barry Cave wiped out a meet record in the junior events.

Wilson, a wiry little athlete who excels in basketball, baseball, soccer and track for Park School, made the most impressive showing of the meet by clearing the bar at 10 feet, 11¾ inches in the pole vault.

Wilson, an 18-year-old senior who stretches but 5-8 ½, had his own CUPS record for the pole vault bettered when he sailed over at 10 feet, but was determined to do better and asked the officials to raise the bar another six inches. Again he made it over with ease and requested that the bar be lifted to 11 feet.

He missed on his first and second chances at the new height, but made a perfect effort on the third try and was over with room to spare. Officials measured the center of the cross bar and found it to be the quarter inch short of 11 feet.

Wilson's coach, Herb Mols, tipped the bar to 11-2, but Wilson failed to get over without knocking the bar off on all three tries. His former meet record was 9-6¼, set last year.

Wilson's first victory in the meet came when he triumphed in the 100 yard hurdles in the good time of :12.6.

Pedersen established a CUPS record for Park by winning the discus test with a heave of 129 feet, 8¼ inches. He wiped out the former CUPS mark of 123-8, set by John Casey of Lakemont four years ago. Pedersen also won the shot put by heaving the ball 39 feet, 11½ inches.

Cave, a husky freshman who has the potential of being one of the area's best in the shot put and discus, set his junior CUPS record in the eight-pound shot with a toss of 49 feet, 1¼ inches. He eclipsed the former standard of 41-7¼, set by Perry Gordon of Allendale last year.

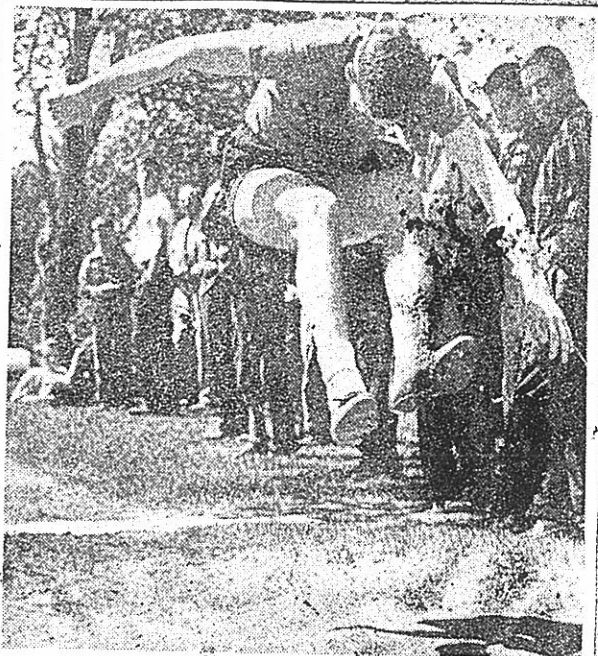
each scored a double win in the senior events, and teammate Steve Cary chalked up a double triumph in the junior team track.

Ron Bell scored a double in the broad jump by leaping 16 feet, 2¼ inches, and took top honors in the pole vault by going over at 5 feet, 5¼ inches. Joe Bell posted his double in the sprints, taking the 100 in :11.2, and the 220 in :25.2.

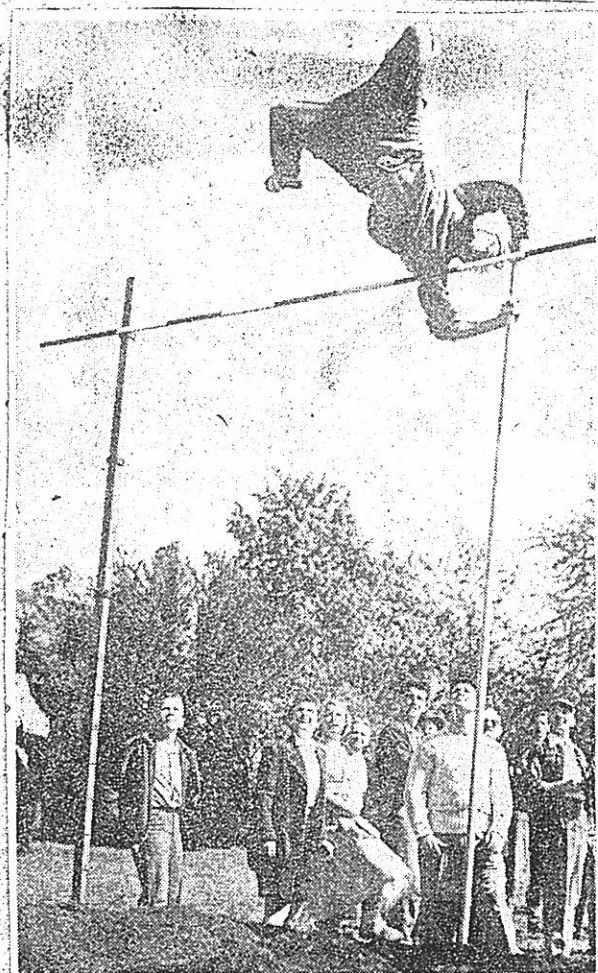
Cary won the junior century in :11.6, the 50-yard dash in :06.3 and triumphed in the broad jump by leaping 16 feet, 2¼ inches.

Don McGowan of DeVeaux snapped the fourth CUPS record of the afternoon by going the junior 100 hurdles in :12.7, bettering the former record of :13.4, set by Art Scantlebury of Lakemont in 1949 and equalled by Pete Ellis of Harley School in '52.

Yesterday's championship was the seventh in nine CUPS meets for Park School. Coach Mols' charges have retired the Syracuse Cup twice and now have one leg on their third trophy.
