

### Park Triumphs In 9th Annual Track Fest

The Park School of Snyder racked up a record-breaking 219 points as it swept its third straight Conference of Upstate Private Track and Field title and its 7th in 8 tries. The Pioneers, performing on their own field for the first time that the meet has been held outside of Rochester, garnered 16 of the 22 first places and gained points in all of the events. The Park athletes had a hand in 5 of the 9 new records. Three age classes are contested, the seniors, over 16, have 12; the juniors, over 14, have 10; while the midgets, under 14, have 5 but which do not count in the scoring.

Steve Cary led all of the performances as he won the junior 50, 100, broad jump and led off the record-breaking junior shuttle relay team.

The meet was climaxed by the pole vault victory of Bob Wilson as he soared to 10 ft. 11 1/2 inches which set CUPS, track and Park School records. Hank Priebe set a midget high jump record of 4 ft. 7 1/2 in.

The Park team gained a leg on the new Syracuse Alumni trophy.

### Baseball Team Moves Into First Place in Dartmouth Cup Race

In a clash of undefeated CUPS baseball teams last Monday at Niagara Falls, Don Lischer bested Pete Kallas and led the Park to its 4th straight CUPS win, 12-6 as DeVeaux suffered its first loss.

Next week Park entertains Allendale in a return game Monday at Park, Neumann Wednesday at Park and will travel to Pebble Hill Friday.

### Park Wins, 16-3, Clinches Title Tie

### PARK SCHOOL GAINS THIRD CONSECUTIVE TITLE IN TRACK

The Park School of Snyder today holds the track and field championship of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools for the third straight year.

Coach Herb Mols' Park athletes easily won their seventh CUPS title by scoring 219 1/2 points on their home field Saturday afternoon. Allendale School of Rochester was second with 121 7/10 points. DeVeaux of Niagara Falls was third, Pebble Hill of Syracuse fourth and Harley School of Rochester placed fifth.

Bob Wilson and Lars Pedersen, double winners for Park, each set a conference record. Wilson set a CUPS pole-vault mark of 10 feet 11 1/2 inches. Pedersen set his conference mark in the discus-throw with a toss of 129 feet 8 1/4 inches.

Park's Barry Cave set a CUPS junior-division record of 49 feet 1 1/4 inches for the 8-pound shot-put. Ron and Joe Bell, twin brothers, also were double winners for Park. The winners in the senior events follow:

### PARK'S TRACKMEN WIN, BUT CANISIUS, ST. JOE SET MARKS

Canisius High and St. Joe trackmen Friday set track records but host Park School scored 77 points to win the triangular meet. Canisius tallied 36 markers. St. Joe 26.

Eight of Park School's points were scored by Barry Cave, a 15-year-old freshman. Cave won the discus with a 129-foot throw. Then he placed second in the 12-pound shot-put with a 44-foot 3-inch effort behind the track record of 46 feet 2 inches set by St. Joe's Noel Reyner.

Canisius' Fran Opiela ran a track-record .555 quarter-mile while teammate Joe Lowicki won the 220-yard dash in track-record time of :24.9. Canisius' mile relay team also set a 3:55 track mark.
