

Salisbury, Cave Set Records In Meet at Nichols

Two school records were shattered as the Nichols School registered 83 points to easily win its third straight championship in the annual Nichols Invitation track meet yesterday.

Park School followed with 24 points, while Lakemont Academy registered 14 and Allendale scored nine.

Giff Salisbury eclipsed the Nichols record in the discus throw with a heave of 145 feet, 11 inches, surpassing the former mark of 136-8 set by Layne Montezano of Nichols in 1952. Walt Gibbs of Nichols was over the old record with a 137-7 effort. Barry Cave of Park set a record in the shot put with heave of 47-4, breaking the record of 42-11 1/2, set by Park's Terry Cheek in 1950.

The meet is conducted in three age classes, senior for those over 16; junior those under 14, and midgets. Places count 8, 5, 3, 2 and 1. The competing schools will be Allendale School, Rochester; DeVeaux School, Niagara Falls; Harley School, Rochester; Pebble Hill School, Syracuse, and Park School.

The morning events will be started at 11 o'clock, with the afternoon program carded for 1:30 o'clock.
