

Park School Runner Sets Mark in Today's Track Meet

PARK'S CARY SETS 2 RECORDS, DEVEAUX LEADS CUPS TRACK

Steve Cary of Park School today set two records in the junior division of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools championship track and field meet at the Park School in Snyder.

Cary lowered the 50-yard dash mark of Park's Tom Zierk by a full second in 5.8 seconds. He also topped Zierk's 100-yard mark with a :10.9. Billy Bridge of Park set the old record in 1948.

DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls scored 50 points to take a slim lead. Harley School of Rochester had 46, followed by Park School, with 42, Pebble Hill of Syracuse, with 21½, and Allendale of Rochester, with 13.

Dave Sargent of Pebble Hill posted a new mark in the 75-yard dash in the midget division. He raced the distance in :09.2. The summaries follow:

Park Retains CUPS Track Crown

The host Park School of Snyder closed with a wallop to take its second straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championship yesterday by compiling 211½ points in a meet in which 11 records were shattered and two others were tied.

The Snyder cinder team, trailing by 0 points with 10 of the 29 events remaining, shut out DeVeaux of Niagara Falls in the senior pole vault, second last event on the program, to take its second leg on the Syracuse Cup. Park earned permanent possession of two cups previously.

DeVeaux finished second with 198, followed by Allendale of Rochester, 74½; Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 42½, and Harley School of Rochester, 21½.

Two of the outstanding records were set by Park School athletes in senior division events. The meet was split into three divisions, midgets for boys 14 and under, juniors for boys 16 and under, and seniors, unlimited.

Barry Cave, Park sophomore, became the fourth athlete in Western New York to break 50 feet in the shot put when he tossed the 12-pound ball 55 feet 5 inches.

His efforts by far wiped out the former meet and Park School record of 45-7, established by Park's Terry Check in 1950.

Three area school boys broke 50 feet in 1955. Bob Faulks of Kenmore was best with a toss of 52-4½, while teammate Stu Zimmerman hit for 50-7.

Roger Bauman of South Park came through with a heave of 51-11 for the Sparks last season.

Cave set another meet record in the discus event with a toss of 132-2. This effort broke the previous mark of 129-8, set by Park's Lars Pederson in the same meet last season.

Tim Fimmel's 2:08.8 showing in the 880 run was also an outstanding effort for Park. His time was the best ever run by a Park athlete and eclipsed the former record of 2:11.5, set by Ron Gundry of Lakemont Academy in 1952.

Steve Cary fractured two individual records, tied another and was a member of a Park relay team which set a new mark in events for the juniors.

In the 50 dash he was timed in :05.8, breaking the record of :05.9 established by Park's Tom Zierk four seasons ago. He broke his second record in the broad jump with a leap of 18 feet 4¼ inches, bettering the record of 17-3 set by Pebble Hill's Ron Rosecrans in '49. He had a :10.9 clocking in the century, matching a record set by Bill Bridge of Park in '48 and tied by Zierk in '52.

He also ran anchor leg on the 440 relay team which crashed to another meet record of :50.8. He teamed with Chuck Eaton, Al Holland and Tim Fimmel to lower the old mark of :51.6, set by a Park team last year.

CAVE'S 2 VICTORIES IN WEIGHTS PACE PARK TRACK TEAM

A pair of records by Park School's Barry Cave Saturday featured the Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field championships on the Park School field in Snyder.

Cave, a 16-year-old sophomore, set meet records in the shot-put and the discus. He tossed the 12-pound shot 50 feet, 5 inches, to become the fourth Western New York schoolboy to better 50 feet. He won the discus with a throw of 132 feet, 2 inches.

Trailing by ten points with two events left, Park School won both to take its second straight CUPS championship with 211½ points. DeVeaux of Niagara Falls was second with 198 points, Allendale of Rochester third with 74½, and Pebble Hill of Syracuse fourth with 43½.

Park's Tim Fimmel set a Senior Division meet record of 2 minutes, 8.8 seconds for the 880-yard run. Park School winners follow:

Park School Tips Crusaders, 56-53

Park School's CUPS track and field champions yesterday turned back Canisius High School, 56-53, in a dual meet held on Park's grass track.

Park's Gary Cave whipped the discus 133 feet to establish a track record and also won the shot put event to be one of three double winners.

Cave's teammate Tom Barker won both the high jump and 100 yard hurdles, while Pete Kritzer of the Griffins blazed the 100 dash in :10.4 and the 220 in :23.5 to be the only double winner for the visitors. Kritzer also anchored the winning Canisius 880 relay team.
