Gibbs Posts Triple Win As Nichols School Scores

The Nichols School track and field team opened its season by compiling 69 points to take the team title in annual Nichols School Invitation, a meet in which six records were established, yesterday at the Nichols field.

Co-Capt. Wally Gibbs, a husky football guard, paved the way for the winning Green and White by scoring a triple in the field events and fracturing the school and meet record in the shot put test.

Gibbs let loose with a heave of 48 feet, 5 inches with the 12-pd. ball as he left his mark with the shot. The former meet and school record for the event was 47-1.

He also won the discus with a toss of 130-7, and the pole vault by scaling the bar at 10 feet. He placed second to Wally Davis of DeVeaux of Niagara Falls in the high jump. Davis went over the bar at 5-8, to better the former meet record by 1/2 inch.

Bill Wesley, the other Nichols

co-capt., scored a double, including a record-breaking win in the mile run. He was timed in 4:49, bettering the former mark of 4:57.4; and triumphed in the broad jump with a leap of 18-6.

Dick Webb of the Big Green blazed to a record in the 440 with a :53.8 performance. The old record was :54.8. He also teamed with Art Rosenberg, Marc Comstock and Chick Smith as Nichols set an 880-relay record of 1:36.5. The former mark was 1:38.

Park School Takes 3rd In CUPS Track Meet

ROCHESTER, May 25 — The defending champion Park School of Snyder compiled 146 points to take third place in the annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools championship track and field meet this afternoon.

Steve Carey scored a triple as he fractured one meet record and tied another to pace the Park Athletes.

He set a conference mark by taking the junior 100-yard dash in :10.7, bettering his own re-

cord of :10.9 set last year, and equalled his conference record set last season for the junior 50 by zipping the distance in :05.8.

He rounded out his triple win by scoring in the junior broad jump with a leap of 17 feet 9 inches.

Tim Finnell also posted a record for Park by winning the senior 880 in 2:07.5, one second faster than the record he set for the event last year. He also copped the senior broad jump with a showing of 18 feet 5/8 inches.

Kees Blekxtoon of Park won the senior 100 in :10.9, while teammate Ron Eaton triumphed in the senior pole vault by clearing the bar at 9 feet 6 inches.

Hank Priebe of Park and Ron MacLeod of DeVeaux of Niagara Falls tied for first in the junior high jump with efforts of 5 feet.

Dave McGowan of DeVeaux set a CUPS record in the senior 440 with a clocking of :55, two seconds better than the former mark.

Host Allendale School gained the team title with 186 points. DeVeaux was next with 155. Following Park were Pebble Hill of Syracuse with 52, and Harley School of Rochester with seven points.

DeVeaux, Park Runners Establish CUPS Records

ROCHESTER, May 27 — DeVeaux School's Dave McGowan set a 440-yard record of 55 seconds, while Park's Tim Finnell set a Conference of Upstate Private Schools' 880-yard run mark of 2:07.5, Saturday in the CUPS championship track-and-field meet at Allendale School.

Allendale won the title, with 186 points to 155 for DeVeaux and 146 for Park in the Senior-Junior competition. Finnell also won the Senior broad-jump with a leap of 18 feet 5/8 inches.
