

Park School Five Defeats Harley

Special to The Courier-Express. ROCHESTER, Jan. 17.— Park School of Buffalo racked up a 69-35 basketball victory over Harley School today in the opening game of CUPS league play.

Guard Jim Hollands was high man for Park with 16 points, while forward Jerry Jacobstein drilled eight and guard Tim Finnell nine. It was Park's highest point total of the season.

The Park defense was up to its usual performance, limiting the Harley starters to a total of 25 points. Sub guard Pete Dygert was high for Harley with eight.

Park plays here again today, meeting the unbeaten defending CUPS champion Allendale School at 10 this morning.
