

## ALLENDALE WINS TRACK CUP; PARK CUBS ARE FIRST

Allendale School of Rochester, paced by a trio of double winners, won the Syracuse Cup in the 13th annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field meet Saturday at Park School of Buffalo.

Allendale compiled 145 points in the senior and junior divisions, which count toward the Syracuse Cup, and also won the midget division with 60½ points.

Park gained first-place in the Cub division with 24 points.

Allendale's Pete Bagg set a Conference record in the junior division with a discus toss of 117 feet, 7 inches. Tom Cary of Park set a new mark in the midget division shot-put. His heave was 42 feet, 1 inch. The winners:

Coach Mols feels his club possesses a good balance of experience and speed, and rates an excellent chance in CUPS championship competition. Last year, Park finished with a 2-5-1 over-all record and won only one of six conference tilts.

It was only the second time since Park initiated six-man football 14 years ago that the school had a losing season. The 1957 season was the first.

Park will open its season with a non-conference game Friday at Mayville.
