

# Park Booters Win, Finish Undefeated

The Park School's undefeated soccer team finished its season by scoring a 6-2 victory over visiting DeVeaux of Niagara Falls yesterday in a Conference of Upstate Private Schools game.

Mike Dozoretz, Bryan Meadows and Mike Steffan registered the goals as Park's CUPS cham-

pions scored their 10th win of the season. Bill Tredennick was the DeVeaux scorer.

DeVeaux clinched a tie for the CUPS football championship by scoring a 19-12 victory over Park on a 5-yard pass play from George Phillips to Brent Davis in the fourth period.

John Lunney scored a pair of TD's for the winners on runs of 28 and 10 yards. Peter Barnes threw to Don MacLeod on a 35-yard aerial play for one Park six-pointer. Toby Klyn raced 25 yards to tally the other. Lunney passed to Dan Colley for a DeVeaux conversion.

DeVeaux has a 4-2 league rec-

ord and a 5-2 slate for the season. Park's league record is 3-3 and its over-all record is 5-3.

## DeVeaux Tips Park, 19-12

DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls pushed over a last-quarter touchdown to score a 19-12 triumph over Park School Friday and secured a share of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools football championship.

John Lunney ran 28 yards for DeVeaux's opening score in the first period. Park retaliated with Peter Barnes hitting Don MacLeod with a 35-yard TD pass.

DeVeaux scored another touchdown lead when Brent Davis hauled in George Phillips' 5-yard touchdown pitch. Park battled back however and squared matters with a third-period score, Toby Klyn carrying 29 yards for the TD.

Park finished its over-all season with a 5-3 mark and was 3-3 in C.U.P.S. play.

## Undefeated Park Thumps CUPS Rivals

Park School's undefeated basketball team chalked up impressive victories over Allendale and Harley last weekend to retain first place in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools' title race. The pair of wins came on the heels of Park's stunning 46-17 upset triumph over Nichols School.

The defending CUPS champions rallied in the second half Saturday to carve out a 59-46 win over Allendale, regarded as the most formidable threat to Park's hopes of retaining the title. The locals had an easier time Sunday by throttling Harley School, 67-26.

### MacLeod, Steffan Shine

Don MacLeod and Mike Steffan set the pace against Allendale with 21- and 18-point efforts, respectively. Mark Smith and Torrey Rogerson put away clutch baskets in the final period to spark Park to its win. Five quick breakaway baskets in the last two minutes secured the triumph.

Allendale held a 22-5 edge in free throws in the first half.

Park opened up a 25-11 halftime advantage over Harley and coasted the rest of the way for a 67-26 conquest. Steffan was high man with 12 points, followed by Mark Smith and MacLeod with 10 apiece.

### DeVeaux Is Next

Park will meet DeVeaux Friday night in Niagara Falls in a key game that will decide first place in the conference. DeVeaux's 51-48 victory over Park last year is the only blemish on the locals' two-year conference record in which they have won 10 of 11 games.

Coach Herb Mols announced that Cardinal Dougherty High School has replaced Batavia High on the Park schedule for a Feb. 5th non-conference clash.
