

**Allendale Is CUPS Champion**

**Park Track Team Second**

 ROCHESTER, May 28 — Five records were set and one tied today as the host school, Allendale, took first place in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools track and field meet.

Allendale, which retired the Syracuse Cup by winning the meet for the third time, scored 172 points. Park School of Buffalo had 88, DeVeaux of Niag-

ara Falls 84, Harley of Rochester 46, and Pebble Hill of Syracuse 26.

Both senior and junior events were counted in the scoring. Separate meets were held for midgets (ages 13-14) and cubs (12 and under). Park won the midget meet with 44 points. Harley scored 35, Allendale 32, DeVeaux 13 and Pebble Hill 7.

In the cubs meet, Pebble Hill won with 32, Allendale had 10, Harley 7 and Park 5.

Allendale's Andy Paterson ran a 4:50.8 mile to set a CUPS record, while its junior 440 relay team, turned in a 4:6.8 clocking for another standard.

Park School was responsible for the other four records. Don Wilson tied the senior 440 mark in :54.2; Tom Cary put the eight-pound shot 52 feet 4 inches; Pete Lechner broad jumped 8-7, and high jumped 4-9, both in the midget class.
