

Park Rallies To Defeat Cattaraugus

Toby Klyn romped 30 yards on a reverse as time ran out to score the touchdown that yesterday gave Park School's six-man football team an exciting 27-24 victory over Cattaraugus.

The game, played at Park, was the opener of the 1960 season for each team.

A 30-yard pass from co-captain Jim Patten to co-captain Neil Stroman set up Klyn's touchdown run, and climaxed a fourth-period rally which saw Park score 15 points to overcome a 24-12 deficit.

Klyn and quarterback Phil Marshall each tallied two touchdowns and passed for another. Marshall raced 60 yards with a punt to open the scoring and Klyn took a 38-yard heave from Marshall to give Park a 12-0 lead in the second quarter.

But Cattaraugus caught up before halftime and went ahead in the third period on a pair of touchdowns.

Klyn passed 22 yards to Marshall and ran the extra point to cut the margin to 24-19 in the fourth quarter. That set the stage for his TD run on the final play, after which he kicked for two extra points.
