DeVeaux Swimmers Capture CUPS Crown

NIAGARA FALLS, March 11 — DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls took eight first places in nine events today to successfully defend its team title in the fourth annual Conference of Upstate Private Schools swimming meet held in the DeVeaux pool.

DeVeaux totaled 66 points. Allendale School (Rochester) was second with 36, Park School had 15, Harley School (Rochester) 5 and Pebble Hill School (Syracuse) 2.

Six CUPS records were set—five by DeVeaux. Bob Worcester set one with a :30.5 clocking in the 50-yard backstroke, Jon Woolverton did :59.7 in the 100-yard freestyle, Tom Palmer :34.6 in the 50-yard breast stroke, and the 200-yard medley relay and 200-yard freestyle relay foursomes in 2:06.6 and 1:52, respectively.

The sixth record was broken by Allendale's Bill George. He did :26.5 in the 50-yard freestyle.

In the junior high meet, Harley won with 23 points. Allendale had 27, DeVeaux 12, Park 9 and Pebble Hill 0.

This year's AMHERST BEE All-Area basketball team is a power-packed quintet that has outstanding scoring ability, rebounding prowess and a strong defense. As in the past, the team was selected from the six local high schools that are in the BEE's circulation area.

Leading the All-Stars is Clarence's Lex Reyburn, the only repeater from last year's team. The rangy guard led the area in foul shots (89) and was second in field goals (85). His 289 points for the season helped pace coach Chuck Fiegli's Red Devils to their first E.C.I.C. Division II championship. Reyburn was also outstanding on defense.

Amherst, co-champions of Division I, placed two men on the dream team. Larry Brassel, the top scorer in the area with 367 points

and a 20.4-points-per-game average, is one of the highest-scoring guards in Tiger history. His effective jump shots and able dribbling kept opponents on edge all season. Teammate Gary Munson, a 6' 3" center, was an outstanding rebounder and a consistent scorer, averaging 14.9 points per game.

Another position on the all-star team goes to Williamsville's Jon Nichols. Only scoring 12.1 points per game, the tall forward came through in the clutch and was a top rebounder. He was also tops on defense.

Probably the most versatile player on the team is Park's Mark Smith. He pushed Brassel for the scoring lead most of the season and finished with 265 points for an 18.9 average. He was a tough man to defend because he could set, jump

and drive effectively. At 5' 10" he got his share of rebounds and was a stellar performer on defense.

All members of the teams are seniors except Munson and Nichols, who are juniors. Named to the second team are Phil Vance and Dan
