ROCHESTER, May 27—Host Allendale School, which retired a Syracuse Alumni Trophy last year, picked up the first leg of the new trophy today by winning the Conference of Upstate Private Schools' 15th annual track and field meet.

Paced by Adam Kreuter, who took first place in the senior 100, discus and shot put, Allendale totaled 137 points in the combined senior-junior events.

DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls was second with 131½. Park School had 108½, Harley School of Rochester 28 and Pebble Hill School of Syracuse had 11.

Park's Pete Lechner dominated the junior division, finishing first in the 100 hurdles, broad jump, tying for first in the high jump and running anchor on the winning 440 shuttle relay team.

In the midget division (under 14), Harley won with 46 points. Pebble Hill had 30, Allendale 14, Park 6 and DeVeaux 5. Park grabbed the cubs division (under 12) with 36 points, while Pebble Hill had 26, Allendale 21 and Harley 11.

4-Mile Handicap Helps Tom McHale Win Olympic Walk

Starting with a 4-mile handicap, Tom McHale this morning won the 2-hour special Olympic development walking event through the Town of Amherst and finishing at the Park School. McHale was credited with 17½ miles.

Second was Chris Laczynski, going 14¼ miles from a 2-mile handicap while Don Hughes was third with 11¼ miles from a 5-mile start. National 50-kilometer champion John Allen, an Olympian, placed fourth, covering 15 miles without a handicap.
