## Two Park School Gridders, 3 Soccer Players on All-Stars

The Park School today placed two six-man football team players and three soccer players on Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) All-Star teams.

The Park gridder honored are sophomore-back Ted Nitterauer and senior-end Jim Kreutzer. Park's Phil Marshall garnered honorable mention.

The CUPS football team also includes George Phillips, Jim Kreutzer senior end, and Tom Hilbert, senior back, both from DeVeaux School of Niagara Falls, and center Pete Bagg and back Bill George, both of champion Allendale of Rochester. DeVeaux honorable mentions were Dave Anderson and Gordon Bennett.

Park soccer players on the CUPS team were senior-goalie Jeff Traeger, junior-fullback

Tom Cary and junior-inside-forward Bill Russell. Park honorable mentions were Peter Lechner, Dean Jewett, Chip Johnston and Lester Saft.

DeVeaux placed center-forward Bob Worcester on the first team, with honorable mention for Pete Cooper, Gary Rosser and Roger Zay.

The CUPS soccer team was rounded out by fullback Chris Dye, halfback Conger Gabel, wings Ben Egel and Dave Mossbrook, inside Randy Prozeller and center-forward Dan Schick, all of the champion Harley School of Rochester. Also halfbacks Tom Tenny and Norm Kendall, both Allendale, and Phil Morse, Pebble Hill of Syracuse.

Park's six-man gridgers broke their own 1953 CUPS scoring record by two points, tallying 226. Allendale led in team defense with 96 points. Park touchdown passes thrown were nine by Marshall, eight by Gary Mols, while Marshall and Kreutzer caught six TD passes apiece.

Dougherty, 4-0, and Clarence, 3-0, will meet at approximately 9 tonight for the title. Park and Akron will battle for third place at 7:30.

Neither Dougherty nor Clarence experienced much difficulty, especially the host Cardinals. Park grabbed an 8-3 lead, then Dougherty got hot and rolled to a 19-9 command at the first quarter's end. Dougherty led at the half, 34-13, and after three periods, 50-25.

All 10 Dougherty players scored, with Dennis O'Connor tallying 18, Paul Pazderski 12 and John Rudowski 11. Craig Robinson's 14 topped Park.

Clarence led all the way against Akron, though never by insurmountable margins. The defending ECIC Division II champions held quarter edges of 12-3, 23-17 and 40-29.
