

## Piepke of Buffalo On Second Team in All-America Soccer

 ONEONTA, Jan. 15 — Walt Piepke, Hartwick sophomore from the Park School of Buffalo, today was chosen on the second team of the 1962 All-America selections of the National Soccer Coaches Association.



Piepke, born in Germany and a resident of Buffalo since 1957, set several school records from his center forward position in leading Hartwick to the New York State championship. He scored 17 goals, a single-season record, and netted at least one in every game on the regular schedule.

The only game in which he failed to score was against Springfield (Mass.) in the National Collegiate Athletic Association Northeastern Regional final. He assisted on Hartwick's only goal in that defeat.

The Buffalonian scored all three of Hartwick's goals against New York University, 1961 state champion, to become the only player in history to score so many against that team. He also scored all three Hartwick goals in the 3-1 victory over Cortland that won the state title.
