**LAKEMONT, N.Y.** — The Park School of Snyder scored four touchdowns in the first half to crush Lakemont Academy, 44-18, Saturday for its fifth six-man football triumph in as many starts in the Conference for Upstate Private Schools.

Lakemont won in soccer blanking Park, 3-0.

Ted Nitterauer sparked the visitors' grid triumph by scoring four touchdowns. He registered both second-period TDs that boosted Park to a 28-6 halftime advantage. He made scoring bursts of 2, 45, 32 and finished with a 30-yard pass-lateral play with John Mayer. Nitterauer passed to Mayer, who flipped the ball back to Nitterauer for the TD.

Gerry Lang paced Park's 17th straight football success by scoring three touchdowns on 65 and 25 yard pass receptions from Gary Mols and a 72-yard return of the opening kickoff.

Park School's six-man football team Friday clinched its second straight Conference of Upstate Private Schools title. The varsity soccer and junior varsity grid teams also scored victories over visiting Pebble Hill of Syracuse.

Park's 62-33 six-man victory over Pebble Hill was the 17th straight over three years for Coach Herb Mols. Herb's son, Gary, scored twice, on a one-yard plunge and an 8-yard pass from Ted Nitterauer. He also drop-kicked four two-point conversions and passed for three TDs, 25 and 65 yards to Gerry Lang and 4 yards to John Mayer after the latter's pass interception.

Lang also scored on a game-opening 72-yard kickoff return. Nitterauer tallied twice, on an 11-yard run and a 65-yard screen-pass from Paul Wischerath.

Gary Gelick's goal gave Park its first soccer victory, 1-0. The Pioneers' JV gridlers won, 19-7.
