

Walker, Park Win Golf Titles

ROCHESTER — Park School of Buffalo won the Conference of Upstate Private Schools golf championship and the Cort Cary Memorial Trophy with a four-man total of 339 Saturday at the Genesee Valley Country Club.

Park's Bill Walker was the medalist with a 7-over-par 77.

Gary Grellek, Park, and Biff Bennett, Harley School of Rochester, tied for second place with 84's.

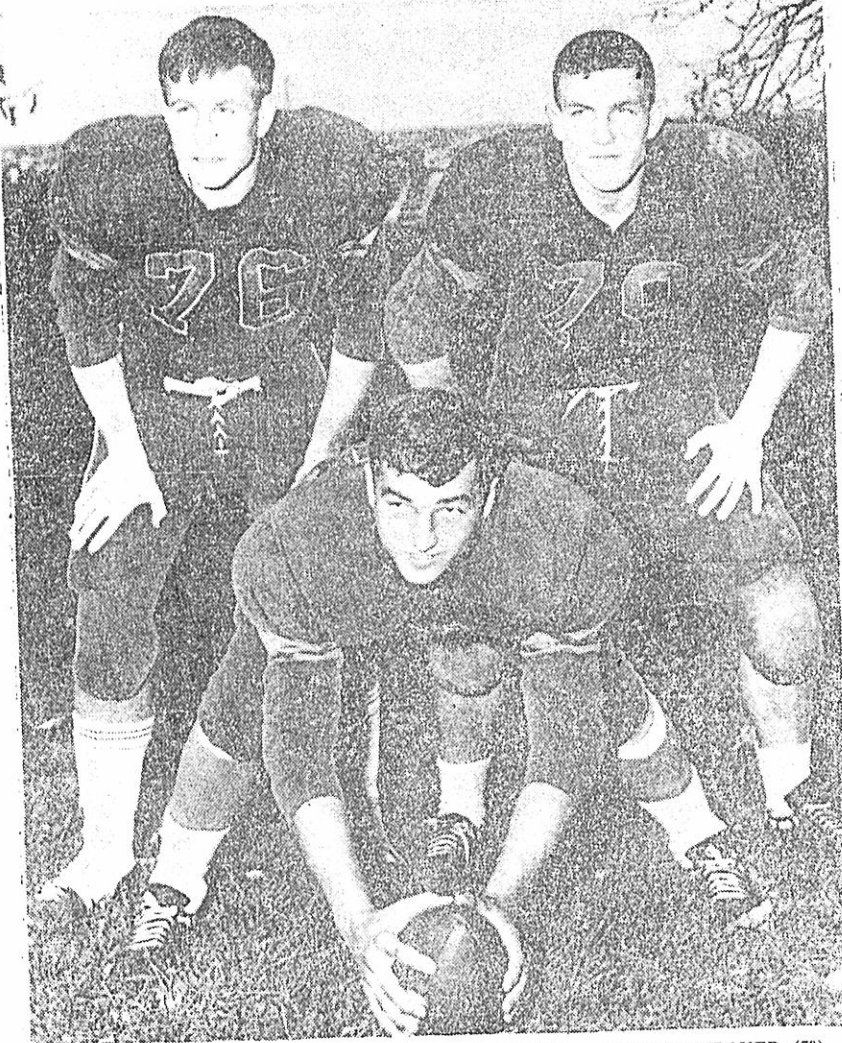
Allendale of Rochester finished second with 359, followed by Harley, the defending champion, 393, and Pebble Hill of Syracuse, 422.

Fred Allen, Allendale, was fourth with 8, followed by Nick Mamula, Park, 33; Bill Simpson, Allendale, 88; Geoff Feltner, Allendale, 89; and Gerry Robinson, Park, 90.

"Touchdown Twins" Will Face Allendale in Finale Friday in Rochester

Park's 'Touchdown Twins' Score 108 Points Apiece

First it was Terry Check and Ted Okie. Then it was Dale Casto and Tom Zierk.

Now, Gary Molls and Ted Nitterauer have taken over the role of the Park School six-man football team's "Touchdown Twins."

This high-scoring duo has scored 108 points apiece in seven games this season, and Coach Herb Mol's Pioneers, Conference of the Upstate champions, have one game remaining, against Allendale in Rochester Friday afternoon. It was Coach Mol's eighth title in the 17 years of CUPS football.

Nitterauer Has 18 TDs

Gary has 13 touchdowns and 15 two-point conversions, all dropkicks, while Ted has 18 TDs.

Gary has already passed Casto's school record of 244 career points, with a four-year varsity total of 251. Nitterauer has moved up to fourth place in the all-time scoring with 206, behind third-place Zierk, 240.

In addition, Molls this season has completed 30 of 61 passes or 597 yards, including nine TD passes, which give him a career school record of 24 scoring aerials. Nitterauer has thrown five TD passes this year, and each have been on the receiving end of three. Nitterauer has gained 584 yards rushing and Molls 379.

Mayer Fills Key Center Role

Somewhat overshadowed by the TD Twins' scoring feats, but nonetheless just as important in the team's success is:

notch skier. Mayer, like Molls and Nitterauer, is a four-year varsity gridder, but unlike them, does not participate in basketball, baseball and track.

Okie, now a doctor of medicine in Buffalo, and Check, a salesman in Ohio, and son of the former Park School headmaster, were the stars 12 years ago. Casto and Zierk, the stars of a decade ago, both are in New York City, the former a businessman; the latter a lawyer.

3/6 Park School Boys Named by CUPS To All-Star Teams

Three Park School athletes, named on Conference of Upstate Private Schools All-Star teams, will be honored this evening at 6 o'clock at a Father & Son Awards Banquet on the Harlem Rd. campus.

They are Gary Molls and Co-Capt. John Mayer in six-man football and Pieter Lechner in soccer. Molls, the son of Coach Herb Molls, quarterbacked Park to another CUPS championship and a conference record of 302 points.

Park's fullback, Ted Nitterauer, established a CUPS' season scoring record of 103 points. Molls also set a Park career mark of 267 points. Molls, second in scoring with 90, set a new point-after-touchdown drop-kick mark of 15.

A total of 37 varsity letters and 20 squad awards will be presented in football, soccer and golf.

Park will receive the Yale Alumni Association of Western New York Football Trophy. Park's undefeated streak will be 18 to start the 1964 season. CUPS selections and award winners follow:
