## Park's Tossers Tip Akron, 72-57

Center Jim Derrick meshed 23 points and pulled off 10 rebounds to pace the Park School to a 72-57 triumph over visiting Akron Tuesday in the basketball opener for both schools.

The game was knotted at 17-17 after the first period, but Derrick led the Snyder team to a 16-point second quarter for a seven-point advantage at halftime, 33-26.

Garry Lang and Jack Brandl also starred offensively for Park, each scoring 12 points. Akron's Jim Berry was the game's top point-producer with 25. Guard Joe Zurlo added 12.

## West Seneca, Gibbons Win

Bishop Gibbons High of North Tonawanda and West Seneca advanced to the final round of the Clarence High Holiday Invitation Basketball Tournament Thursday night. Gibbons posted an exciting 60-58 triumph over Clarence after West Seneca drubbed Park School, 73-51.

The Gibbons-West Seneca title game will be played tonight after Park and Clarence meet in the consolation opener at 7:15.

Scoring the majority of his points off the boards, forward Ed Harmon paced the close Gibbons' triumph with 28 points. Gibbons held a 29-20 advantage at halftime, but Clarence erased it and forged into a 51-50 lead midway through the final stanza. Then Harmon's steady shooting from close quarters rallied the Msgr. Martin Catholic League team to victory.

Guard Bob Orr sparked the Clarence attack with 16 points. Denny Gonzales added 13. The win was Gibbons' third in four games. Clarence has a 1-3 mark.

Erratic foul shooting proved fatal to the Red Devils. They converted only six of 16 charity heaves. Gibbons hit on 12 of 23.

West Seneca never trailed in its win over Park. Guard Todd Vogel paced all scorers with 23 points. Teammate Mike Powell contributed 18 and Leon Swartz had 12.

The Indians, who took their third win in four outings, led 33-28 at the half.
