Park Thumps Lakemont 5 By 104-61

LAKEMONT—Park Academy, considered the top club in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools, showed the Lakemont Chiefs why, Saturday, by racing to a 104-61 victory over the Chiefs.

An upset loser to Allendale, Park has a 6-1 record in conference action so far. Five players hit in double figures with Jim Derrick tossing in 20 and Garry Mols and Pete Lechner hitting 19 each to lead the attack.

Dave Sindelman and Greg Borowski paced the Chiefs with 18 and 17 points respectively. Dick Shaffer had 12 points.

Park leaped to a 23-8 first period lead and after the Chiefs had battled on even terms in the second period, Park exploded with 31 and 32 points in the final two periods while Lakemont could tally only 35 for the half.

Park School Cagers Win 7th CUPS Crown

Guard Gary Mols, the coach's son, meshed 36 points—a team high for the season—as Park School clinched its seventh Conference of Upstate Private Schools basketball championship Friday with an 87-52 victory over visiting Allendale.

The easy triumph finished Park's season with a 7-1 CUPS record and a 13-5 over-all mark. This marks the fifth time that Coach Herb Mols' quintet has won the title outright. Park was co-champion on two occasions.

Allendale, which could have taken over first place by winning, is now relegated to the runner-up spot with a 5-2 log. The Rochester team has one game left.

Mols sank 14 field goals and eight foul shots for his season-high total. He was five points

MOLS LEADS PARK TO 7TH TITLE

Gary Mols Friday night led the Park School basketball team to its seventh championship in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools.

The son of Coach Herb Mols scored 36 points as Park defeated visiting Allendale of Rochester, 87-52. Park finished with a won-7 lost-1 CUPS record and is 13-5 over-all. Allendale is 5-2 in league play with a game remaining.

Allendale handed Park its only CUPS loss, 60-49, earlier in the season.

Jim Derrick had 22 points and 21 rebounds for the winners.

Cough Herb Mols

Herb Mols has been basketball coach at Park School for 17 years and has instituted the Conference of Upstate Private Schools league in which his teams compete. The league is composed of five private schools with each team playing each of the other four teams twice during the season to comprise an eight game schedule.

Park School this year won its 7th CUPS championship with a 7-1 record to win the Cornell Cup sponsored by the Cornell Club of Buffalo.

Park had two distinctions this year over other area basketball teams. They had the highest single-game point output with a 104-61 victory over Lakemont and the highest number of points scored by a player in one game with a 36-point performance by Gary Mols against Allendale of Rochester.

Park was sparked this year by Jim Derrick, who averaged 21.2 points per game, and playmaker Gary Mols, who netted 15.6 per game.
