

Park School Skiers Win Third Title, Retire Trophy

The Park School Saturday won its third straight title in the Glenwood Acres winter games, taking permanent possession of the team trophy.

Park rolled up 13 points to 10 for Hamburg Junior High, which finished second. Orchard Park Junior High was third with six points.

Saturday's races wound up two days of competition by the top high school skiers from an original group of about 2500 who

Park Ski Unit Holds Loop Title

Park School of Buffalo kept the ski championship of the Conference of Upstate Private Schools (CUPS) Saturday in a day-long meet at Glenwood Acres ski center in Colden.

Park, paced by Larry Buck, rolled up 413 points. Allendale of Rochester was second with 328; Harley School, also of Rochester, third with 285, and Lakemont Academy of Watkins Glen fourth with 145.

Skiers from the four schools competed in slalom and giant slalom. A total of 48 boys and girls started the 1,800-foot, 50-gate slalom and 26 finished. Then 58 started the 25-gate giant slalom course and 43 finished.

Judges took the top eight finishers from each school in compiling the point score.

Buck ran the slalom in 36.4 seconds to take first place from Jon Emerson of Allendale. Then Emerson had a good run of 25.1 seconds in the giant slalom and beat out Buck.

Geoff Feltner of Harley was third in both races and Allan Hayes of Park fourth.

Park Leads Both Races

Jack Quin of Allendale was fifth in the slalom and sixth in the giant slalom. Jim Osborne of Allendale took fifth in the giant slalom and Woody Crosby of Park sixth in the slalom.

Park skiers received 141 points for the slalom and 272 for the giant slalom to lead in both races.

The meet next year has been scheduled for Swain ski center in Allegany County.

PARK RETAINS CUPS SKI TITLE FOR THIRD YEAR

Larry Buck, a Park School of Buffalo varsity track and soccer man, Saturday paced his school to its third straight triumph in the Conference of Upstate Private Schools' ski meet at Glenwood Acres.

Buck, a junior, finished first in the slalom with a time of 36.4 seconds. He also finished second in the giant slalom, which was won by Jon Emerson of Allendale of Rochester in :25.1.

Park's winning team total was 413 points to 328 for Allendale, 285 for Harley of Rochester, and 145 for Lakemont Academy of Watkins Glen.

Emerson finished second behind Buck in the slalom, Geoff Feltner, Harley, was third; Allan Hayes, Park, fourth, and Jack Quin, Allendale, fifth.

In the giant slalom, Feltner finished third, Hayes was fourth, and Jim Osborne of Allendale was fifth.
